### I. ENTRIES

### a) ISU European Figure Skating Championships 2026

The following ISU Members shall have the right to enter more than 1 competitor, pair or dance couple:

For the ISU World Junior Figure Skating Championships all Competitors must have reached at least the age of thirteen and must not have reached the age of nineteen for Women and Men in singles competition. For Pair Skating, not reached the age of twenty-one for Women and the age of twenty-three for Men. For Ice Dance, not reached the age of twenty-one for Women and the age of twenty-one for Men. For Pair Skating and Ice Dance, a maximum age gap of seven years is allowed between the two partners.

The required Combined Total Elements Score (SP/RD + FS/FD) to participate in Senior ISU Championships (ISU European Figure Skating Championships, ISU Four Continents Figure Skating Championships and ISU World Figure Skating Championships) can only be obtained in Senior International Competitions. Likewise, the required Minimum Combined Total Elements Score for the Short Program/Rhythm Dance and the Free Skating/Free Dance segment to participate in the ISU World Junior Figure Skating Championships can only be obtained in International Junior Competitions.

COMMUNICATION

The Combined Total Elements Score (not including Component Scores) is calculated by adding the Skaters/Couples highest Technical Elements Score in Short Program / Rhythm Dance and the Free Skating / Free Dance and must have been reached in an ISU recognized International Competition during the ongoing or preceding season. The Skaters/Couples highest Technical Elements Score in Short Program / Rhythm Dance and the Free Skating / Free Dance to calculate the Combined Technical Elements Score may be reached at different competitions.

The Minimum Technical Elements Score must be reached 28 (twenty-eight) days before the first day (first official practice day) of the Championships concerned (same as entry deadline).

If it would become evident that the number of entries based on the Combined Total Elements Scores listed above would be significantly higher or lower than expected, the ISU Council reserves the right to adjust the Combined Total Elements Scores in order to achieve the abovementioned objective.

ISU Members will be informed latest 45 days prior to the entry deadline of the respective Championships if the announced required Combined Total Elements Score will be adjusted or will remain as announced. In case of the continental Championships the announcement for both European and Four Continents Championships will be made 45 days prior to the entry deadline of the earlier Championships, in this case the European Championships.

Teams participating in the following Synchronized Skating Championships must have reached the following Combined Total Elements Scores (SP + FS) during the ongoing season (2025/26) or the immediately preceding season (2024/25):

# ISU World Synchronized Skating Championships 2026: CTES: 43.00

#### ISU World Junior Synchronized Skating Championships 2026: CTES: 35.00

The required Combined Total Elements Score (SP + FS) to participate in ISU Worlds Synchronized Skating Championships can only be obtained in Senior International Competitions. Likewise, the required Minimum Total Elements Score for the Short Program and the Free Skating segment to participate in the ISU World Junior Synchronized Skating Championships can only be obtained in International Junior Competitions.

The Combined Total Elements Score (not including Component Scores) is calculated by adding the Teams highest Technical Elements Score in Short Program and the Free Skating and must have been reached in an ISU recognized International Competition during the ongoing or preceding season. The Teams highest Technical Elements Score in Short Program and the Free Skating to calculate the Combined Technical Elements Score may be reached at different competitions.

The Minimum Technical Elements Score must be reached 28 (twenty-eight) days before the first day (first official practice day) of the Championships concerned (same as entry deadline).

If it would become evident that the number of entries based on the Combined Total Elements Scores listed above would be significantly higher or lower than expected, the ISU Council reserves the right to adjust the Combined Total Elements Scores in order to achieve the abovementioned objective.

ISU Members will be informed latest 45 days prior to the entry deadline of the respective Championships if the announced required Combined Total Elements Score will be adjusted or will remain as announced.

#### II. ENTRY DEADLINES

a) Single and Pair Skating & Ice Dance

Entries by name must reach the Sport Directors (through the ISU Secretariat) and the Organizing Committee simultaneously by **28 days** before the first day (first official practice day) of the Championships concerned.



b) Synchronized Skating

Entries of teams must reach the Sport Directors (through the ISU Secretariat) and the Organizing Committee simultaneously by **28 days** before the first day (opening and first draws) of the Championships concerned.

The names of all Team Skaters including alternates may be finally announced at the time of registration.

# The exact deadlines are issued in the Official Announcement for each ISU Championships.

ISU Members are reminded that post entries might be accepted by the ISU President only in case of clearly and truly exceptional circumstances.

Entries from Belarus and Russia are all subject to the lifting of protective measures as per ISU Communication 2469.
