STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION

For more than thirty years, figure skating has been a central part of my life—as an athlete, a student of the sport, and a committed member of the skating community. I have had the unique experience of competing and spectating during both the 6.0 judging era and the current International Judging System. Because of this, I have witnessed firsthand how profoundly the sport has evolved: how artistry and athleticism have been rebalanced, how technical demands have shifted, and how the expectations placed on athletes have changed with each new rule cycle. These decades of perspective have shaped not only my love for skating, but also my understanding of the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead.

My motivation to join the ISU Athletes Committee comes from a deep desire to support the ongoing growth of figure skating and to ensure that the athlete's voice remains central in that process. Having lived through the transition from 6.0 to IJS, I understand both the strengths and shortcomings of each system. I believe the sport is at an important moment—one where continued evolution is essential, not just in judging and scoring, but in athlete well-being, communication, transparency, social media partnering and global accessibility.

I hope to contribute ideas that help refine the balance between technical difficulty and artistic expression, strengthen developmental pathways for young skaters, and reinforce a culture where athletes feel protected, respected, and heard. Above all, I want to serve as a thoughtful, experienced representative who can advocate for progress while honoring the traditions that make figure skating so special. It would be an honor to support the ISU and the global skating community through this committee.

SUI WENJING**STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION**

I am Sui Wenjing, an athlete who has dedicated over 20 years to the pairs figure skating discipline. From a young girl who walked two hours in minus 30- degree Celsius cold to pursue her dream at the Harbin ice rink, to becoming the only skater in the history of world pairs skating to achieve the Grand Slam, I once set a new Olympic record with a total score of 239.88 points in pairs skating, and also endured the pain of a ligament rupture to restart my training from just 2.5 kilograms on the recovery scale. These experiences have made me deeply understand that every athlete's growth path is intertwined with passion and perseverance, challenges and breakthroughs.

My multiple roles both on and off the ice have given me a comprehensive understanding of the needs of the athlete community. As an active athlete, I personally experience the impact of rule iterations on training. Currently, I am adapting to the new rule changes of the International Skating Union (ISU) with my partner, striving to extend my athletic career on the ice. As a choreographer and supporter of the youth team, I have created championship-winning programs for young skaters such as Zhang Jiaxuan and Huang Yihang, integrating Chinese cultural elements like Wa ethnic music and Tai Chi into the international arena. Furthermore, by researching fatigue recovery mechanisms for young athletes, I am exploring solutions for scientific training. As a director of the opening ceremony of the Asian Winter Games, I have witnessed the communication power of sports in diverse scenarios and am well aware of the importance of cross-field development for an athlete's professional lifecycle.

If elected as a member, I will focus on three core tasks: first, conveying authentic voices – transforming my personal insights, from training injuries to career transition, into a bridge for communication, and reflecting athletes' urgent needs regarding rule fairness, injury protection, and post-retirement transition; second, promoting experience inheritance – sharing the technical and psychological adjustment experiences accumulated from my Grand Slam journey, combined with scientific research results, with young athletes around the world; third, facilitating cultural integration– using figure skating as a link to bring more ethnic cultural elements to the world through the sports stage, while building a communication platform for athletes from different disciplines.


STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION

Short track has been the central pillar of my life for many years—first as a child with a dream, then as a top-level athlete, and now as a scholar and advocate for athlete wellbeing. Competing at the highest level of our sport, I have participated in World Cups and European Championships and reached final and semifinals 12 times, top 10 on WJCh, and got a special invitation of the IOC President for the OWG 2018. These experiences have given me honor, resilience, and success—but also firsthand insight into the pressures, uncertainty, and challenges that elite athletes face every day.

Alongside my athletic career, I pursued a PhD focused on sport and mental health. Living both realities at the same time—elite performance and academic research—has shown me that excellence and wellbeing are not opposites. They must coexist. Too many athletes struggle in silence, worried that acknowledging mental strain will be seen as weakness or risk their career. I want to help change this culture.

Through my work with IOC and EOC initiatives, I have contributed to building practical platforms that support athletes beyond competition. With my interest in statistics and database systems, I understand how to turn ideas into functional tools—resources that athletes can actually access, use, and trust. This combination of lived experience, research, and technical skills allows me to contribute not only vision but implementation.

If elected to the ISU Athlete Committee, I will strongly advocate for safe, fair, and pleasant sports experience—where rules protect athletes and give opportunities to develop. Beyond that, I am deeply committed to helping athletes prepare for a second career while still competing, and to strengthening mental well-being support throughout an athlete's journey, not only at its end.

I stand for athletes who perform, study, struggle, grow, and dream. I want to ensure that our voices are heard, our futures are protected, and our sport remains a place where excellence and humanity thrive together.

STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION

Throughout my skating career, I gradually came to realize that competition results alone cannot fully describe an athlete's experience. I humbly believe that athlete safety, a supportive environment, and a prolonged skating career are influenced far more by what is shaped outside the rink—by regulations, systems, and the way these issues are discussed internally.

Having competed in three consecutive Olympic Games and numerous ISU events, I have experienced different competitive environments and organizational structures firsthand. In particular, serving as Olympic National Team Captain on two occasions gave me responsibilities beyond performance. I delivered athletes' opinions and helped coordinate communication within the team, while working hard to maintain balance in high-pressure situations. Through this process, I learned that leadership in sport is not built on authority, but on responsibility, listening, and trust.

My understanding of athlete representation deepened further through my role as an Athlete Representative at the Korea Anti-Doping Agency (KADA). By observing how athletes' real experiences are connected to institutional discussions and policy reviews, I learned that effective representation requires fairness and objectivity, as well as an understanding of both athletes' realities and organizational responsibilities. This experience reinforced my belief that athletes' voices must be conveyed carefully and responsibly in order to lead to meaningful outcomes.

Based on my learning and experience, I decided to apply to the ISU Athlete Commission to help carry athletes' voices onto the international stage. I hope to represent athletes from different backgrounds and career stages, and to contribute to discussions that consider not only performance, but also safety and athlete happiness. I believe that athlete well-being is not separate from achievement, but a condition that must be protected for athletes to continue competing over time. With a strong sense of responsibility, I hope to serve as a representative that athletes can trust.

I am writing to express my motivation to continue serving on the ISU Athletes' Commission and to further strengthen athlete representation within the International Skating Union. Over the past four years, I have had the privilege of representing athletes' voices at the ISU level and working constructively with stakeholders to deliver tangible outcomes. During this period, I have actively contributed to successful rule changes, particularly regarding sponsorship regulations on skinsuits and helmets, as well as competition-related rules that directly impact athletes' professional and sporting environment. These changes were the result of continuous dialogue with athletes and a clear commitment to translating their concerns into actionable proposals.

A key initiative I am particularly proud of is the introduction of structured athletes' meetings at the World Championships. These meetings proved to be highly successful, both in terms of participation and the quality of collective thinking. They provided athletes with a dedicated forum to exchange ideas, identify common challenges, and formulate concrete proposals. As a direct outcome, several athlete-driven rule change ideas are already implemented in the guidance this season and more are scheduled to be discussed at the upcoming ISU Congress, with the clear objective of shaping regulations in line with athletes' wishes and expectations.

I have always made myself available to athletes, believing that accessibility and trust are fundamental to effective representation. If re-elected, I am committed to building on this foundation. My objective is to establish regular athletes' meetings twice per season—one at the beginning and one at the end—allowing for structured planning, continuous feedback, and meaningful follow-up on proposed changes.

I am highly motivated to continue this work, to further professionalize athlete engagement, and to ensure that athletes remain at the center of ISU decision-making. I would be honored to continue serving and contributing to a transparent, athlete-centered future for our sport.
