STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION

I represented Hungary as a senior synchronized skater for eight years, including participation in six World Synchronized Skating Championships. Supporting teammates through pressure, setbacks, and transitions taught me that safeguarding and mental wellbeing are not abstract concepts, but daily realities that directly influence performance and long-term motivation.

Alongside my sporting career, I developed professional experience in international banking governance. As Business Manager to the Country Manager of ING Bank Hungary, I contribute to strategic planning, regulatory framework development, organizational development initiatives, and senior management decision-making. This dual perspective - as an athlete and as a professional working within complex governance structures - allows me to bridge the gap between institutional processes and the lived experiences of athletes.

From June 2025, I have also been working as a synchronized skating coach at development level, supporting young athletes in their early competitive journeys. Guiding them has strengthened my commitment to safe sport, education, and sustainable athlete development, including preparation for life after competition.

If elected to the ISU Athletes' Committee, I would bring dedication, empathy, and responsibility to the role. My goal is to contribute to open dialogue, strengthen athlete representation, and support the values of ISU Vision 2030 by ensuring that athlete wellbeing, integrity, and long-term development remain central to the future of our sport.

STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION (1/2)

My name is Tessa Tamminen, and I am a former Finnish national team athlete in synchronized skating, and a former team captain of Marigold IceUnity. I am writing to express my candidacy for the ISU Athletes' Commission. I am motivated by a strong desire to represent athletes' voices in international decision-making and to contribute to a skating culture that supports long, healthy and sustainable careers across all disciplines.

Having experienced elite sport from the inside, I know how deeply committed skaters are to their sport and how much they sacrifice to pursue excellence. Too often, however, the environment around us does not fully support long-term careers. Often, simply sustaining a career into one's mid-twenties is already seen as a significant achievement. As a community, our ambition should reach further. Supporting longer careers benefits athletes individually and contributes to the long-term development and maturity of our sport. Especially seeing career ending not because their motivation or potential has run out, but because of structural, financial or cultural limitations. My own career came to an end due to a lack of resources, and this has become a personal motivation for me: I want to work towards a future where far fewer athletes have to face the same reality.

I believe that no athlete who is capable of performing at the highest level, or striving towards it, should have to quit due to financial reasons. Supporting professionalism and more sustainable career pathways for skaters is therefore one of my core priorities. Since ending my athletic career, I joined the Finnish Athletes' Association, as a founding member and have served as a board member since 2023. Through this role, I have gained broad insight into the structures, best practices and challenges of different sports. This perspective has highlighted how much potential our sport still has to grow in supporting more professionalized career pathways. Elite sport and professional sport are not synonymous, and bridging this gap is an important development step for figure skating as a whole.

If elected, I want to actively bring athletes' perspectives to the ISU and work towards an environment that enables longer careers, better well-being, and safer training cultures. A safe sporting environment is the foundation of everything we do. Athletes must be able to train, compete and develop in a culture of respect, trust and transparency. Long-term success in our sport is not built only on results, but on the well-being of the people behind those results.

STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION (2/2)

Transparency is another key issue I want to advocate for. Many athletes experience the ISU as distant, and decision-making processes can feel unclear or inaccessible. I believe that skaters should genuinely understand what structures exist to support them and how they can have an impact. This supports our collective ability to develop the sport in a healthy direction.

As a former synchronized skating athlete, I am particularly passionate about integrating synchro more strongly into the wider skating community. Synchronized skating has enormous potential to strengthen the sense of belonging within our sport, while also offering pathways towards professionalism for our athletes. Stronger connections between disciplines can benefit all skaters by creating shared platforms, mutual understanding and more unified athlete representation.

The Olympic dream lives strongly among skaters and developments of Synchro 9 represent a particularly fertile moment for synchronized skating. Achieving Olympic inclusion would open significant opportunities to increase resources and visibility for the discipline and for skating more broadly. I believe this is a moment when athletes' voices are especially important, to ensure that development happens in a way that truly serves the skaters themselves and supports sustainable, long-term careers.

Finally, I am deeply aware that the skating community consists of countries of very different sizes and resources. This became concrete during the spring 2024, when I had the opportunity to work as a visiting coach in Australia and become familiar with local practices and training opportunities. I see it as essential that the voices of athletes from both large and small skating nations are heard. One of my goals is to help gather and amplify these diverse perspectives so that the Athletes' Commission can reflect the true diversity of our sport.

I am applying for this role because I care deeply about the future of skating and the people within it. I want to be a bridge between athletes and the ISU, helping to create a culture where skaters feel heard, supported and valued, not only as performers, but as people.
