ISU Travel Contribution Support 2026

As announced during the 60th Ordinary ISU Congress in Tenerife, the ISU will provide an additional annual Travel Contribution to support ISU Members with growing travel costs and also respecting ISU Vision 2030 to maximize competitive opportunities for all involved in ISU disciplines.

This annual support will be provided in addition to the travel contribution already paid to ISU Members based on athletes participating at ISU Championships and transferred after the season, or other specific travel contributions.

The annual travel contribution is calculated based on participation of ISU Members at ISU Events over the past three seasons, i.e. 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26.

ISU Members have been classified in four (4) groups per Branch depending on the total number of athletes entered.

The classification will be continuously updated. At the conclusion of 2026/27 season, participation numbers will be added and season 2023/24 will be removed, and so on for future seasons.
