## Rules and Regulations

### General Rules

ISU Championships are held in accordance with the International Skating Union (ISU) [Special Regulations and Technical Rules](#). The ISU Judging System used at the Figure Skating events is the one adopted by the 2004 ISU Congress. It is constructed as follows:

### Competition Officials

#### Technical Panel

The Technical Panel is composed of the Technical Controller and two Technical Specialists, each one from different ISU Members (countries). A Data Operator assists them for recording purposes. An instantaneous slow-motion video replay system operated by a Replay Operator supports the Technical Panel in the identification of the performed elements.

The Technical Specialists identify and call the performed elements and the specific Levels of Difficulty of certain performed elements (e.g. spins, footwork). They identify illegal or additional elements and falls.

The Technical Controller authorizes and/or corrects all calls, supervises the Data Operator and can propose corrections, if necessary.

In case of disagreement, the majority among the three Officials prevails.

#### Judges

Under the ISU Judging System the Judges focus entirely on evaluating the quality of each element performed (Technical Score) and the quality of the performance (Presentation Score).

Their scores will be based on specific quality criteria for each element and will provide a comprehensive assessment of each skater's skills and performance, without comparing each skater in relation to all others. The Judge enters the scores through a touch screen unit. At ISU Events, Judges may review in real time certain elements of the skaters' performances by means of an instantaneous Video Replay System.

There will be a panel of a maximum of 9 Judges per segment. The scores of these Judges will form the result. Out of these scores, the highest and lowest score of each element or program component are ignored and the average will be taken from the remainder, generating the trimmed mean (average score).

#### Technical Score

Each element performed has a base value and the judges assign a "Grade of Execution" to the element allowing the element to increase in value when done well or decrease in value when done poorly. Each plus or minus step in the GOE results in increasing or decreasing the value by 10 % in Single and Pair Skating and by 16 % in Ice Dance.

A group of experts, including experienced skaters and coaches, have worked out a summary list of each element's Base Value as well as its "Level of Difficulty" in case of spins, steps, lifts, etc. The level of points of the Base Value depends on the difficulty of the element.

Some elements such as spins and footwork sequences are further broken down depending on their "Level of Difficulty".

These element Base Values and Levels of Difficulty ensure that skaters receive the appropriate and consistent credit for every element performed. The Base Value of all recognized elements are reviewed by the respective Technical Committees and published annually by the ISU in a Communication.

The name of the identified element will be listed instantaneously on the Judge's screen. The Judge then simply grades the quality of the element on a scale of +5, +4, +3, +2, +1, 0, -1, -2, -3, -4, -5. With this scale and the resulting "quality judgment", the Judge can either increase or decrease the Base Value of each performed element.

The total of all the elements scores gives the Technical Score.

### **Presentation Score**

In addition to the Technical Score, the Judges will award points on a scale from 0.25 to 10.00 with increments of 0.25 for the Presentation Score to grade the overall presentation of the performance with three (3) Program Components: Composition, Presentation, Skating Skills. For Pair Skating and Ice Dance there must be equal demonstration of the criteria by both skaters.

The Components definitions and criteria have been reduced from five to three in 2022 and have been updated in order to avoid possible overlapping and make the criteria more understandable and clear. Please refer to the [Program Components FAQ](#) for further information.

- **Composition** refers to how the program is designed in relation to the music and contains connection between and within the elements, pattern/ice coverage, multidimensional movement and use of space, choreography reflecting musical phrase and form.
- **Presentation** evaluates how the program is performed and includes expressiveness and projection, variety and contrast of energy and movements, musical sensitivity and timing; oneness and awareness of space (for Pair Skating, Ice Dance and Synchronized Skating).
- **Skating Skills** is defined by variety and clarity of edges, steps, movements, turns and directions, body control, balance and glide, flow, power and speed; unison (for Pair Skating and Ice Dance).

## Final Score

The Total Segment Score for each participant in each Segment of a competition (Short Program/Rhythm Dance, Free Skating/Free Dance or Pattern Dance(s)) is calculated by adding the Total Elements Score and the Program Component Scores, subtracting any deductions (for example -1.0 for a fall).

In Ice Dance, for events with two Pattern Dances, the Total Score for each dance will be multiplied by a factor of 0.5.

The Total Segment Score of both programs are added and the result constitutes the Final Score in a competition. The participant with the highest total score wins.

## Availability of Data and Statistics

At the end of each segment, a list will be published which includes all relevant scoring data for skaters.

Under the ISU Judging System there is far more data available to analyze than before. This data can help the National Federations, athletes and coaches to improve future performances.

The media, skating fans and general public can find statistics and detailed data on the ISU [Home of Skating](#) website.

## Officials Accountability

The Skaters' performances are video recorded and can be reviewed on screen at any time.

A computer checks and identifies possible anomalies which are further checked by an appointed Officials Assessment Commission. These anomalies can either be supported or refuted by the Commission as possibilities for a variance in the scoring. Refuted possibilities or repeated errors by a single official could result in a sanction.

## Most important changes accepted by the ISU Congress 2024

1. The maximum age for Junior competitors in Pair Skating has been raised to 21 for the female partner and 23 for the male partner. The maximum age for female Ice Dance partners in Junior competitions has been raised to 21 years. A maximum age gap of seven years is allowed between the partners in Ice Dance and Pair Skating at the Junior level.
2. There is no Draw for the Free Skating/Free Dance. The starting order is the reverse order of the results of the Short Program/Rhythm Dance or Pattern Dance(s).
3. Somersault type jumps such as the backflip are no longer illegal and may be included as a choreographic element.

## Most important changes accepted by the ISU Congress 2022

1. The minimum age for participation in ISU senior-level competitions will be gradually raised to seventeen. The age eligibility of 15 years remained the same for the season 2022/23. For the 2023/24 season, only Skaters who have reached at least the age of sixteen before July 1 preceding the event are eligible for international senior-level competitions and ISU senior-level Championships. From the season 2024/25 onwards, the age limit for international senior-level competitions will be raised to seventeen years. For more information please refer to the [Age limit FAQ](#).

## Most important changes accepted by the ISU Congress 2021

1. Change from ‘Ladies’ to ‘Women’ throughout ISU Rules: the change in terminology from ‘Ladies’ to ‘Women’ throughout the Special Regulations and Technical Rules of all ISU sports is in accord with the recommendation of the IOC Gender Equality Review Project that there be a fair and balanced portrayal (i.e. how women and men are presented and described) in all forms of communication and official documents, including rules and regulations.
2. Number of Olympic entries: the maximum number of entries for the Olympic Winter Games as well as the respective number of best placed Competitors to qualify for the Free Skating/ Free Dance, shall be in accordance with the IOC Qualification System for each edition of the Olympic Winter Games to reflect that the IOC is the decision-making body when it comes to the Olympic Qualification Systems.

## Combined Total Elements Scores

Skaters/couples participating in ISU Figure Skating Championships must have reached a Combined Total Elements Scores (CTES) from the Short Program/Rhythm Dance and Free Skating/Free Dance during the ongoing season (2024/25) or the immediately preceding season (2023/24) as published in [ISU Communication 2657](#), paragraph I e).

#### Short Program Singles

The Short Program for Single Skating (Senior and Junior) consists of seven (7) required elements as listed below. The sequence of the elements is optional. No extra marks are obtained by extending the program to the maximum time allowed if this is unnecessary. The music is chosen by each Competitor, vocal music with lyrics is permitted.

#### Senior Men

- a) Double or triple Axel Paulsen;
- b) Triple or quadruple jump;
- c) Jump combination consisting of a double jump and a triple jump or two triple jumps or a quadruple jump and a double jump or a triple jump;
- d) Flying spin;
- e) Camel spin or sit spin with only one change of foot;
- f) Spin combination with only one change of foot;
- g) Step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

#### Senior Women

- a) Double or triple Axel Paulsen;
- b) Triple jump;
- c) Jump combination consisting of a double jump and a triple jump or two triple jumps;
- d) Flying spin;
- e) Layback/sideways leaning spin or sit or camel spin without change of foot;
- f) Spin combination with only one change of foot;
- g) Step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

#### Junior Men

- a) Double or triple Axel Paulsen;
- b) Double or triple Flip jump;
- c) Jump combination consisting of a double and a triple jump or two triple jumps;
- d) Flying camel spin;
- e) Sit spin with only one change of foot;
- f) Spin combination with only one change of foot;
- g) Step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

### **Junior Women**

- a) Double Axel Paulsen;
- b) Double or triple Flip jump;
- c) Jump combination consisting of two double jumps or one double and one triple jump or two triple jumps;
- d) Flying camel spin;
- e) Layback / sideways leaning spin or camel spin without change of foot;
- f) Spin combination with only one change of foot;
- g) Step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

### **Free Skating Singles**

Free Skating consists of a well-balanced program of Free Skating elements, such as jumps, spins, steps and other linking movements executed with a minimum of two footed skating in harmony with music of the Competitor's choice, vocal music with lyrics is permitted.

### **Well Balanced Program**

#### **Senior Men**

- maximum of 7 jump elements (one of which must be an Axel type jump);
- maximum of 3 spins, one of which must be a spin combination, one a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance and one a spin with only one position;
- maximum of 1 step sequence;
- maximum of 1 choreographic sequence.

#### **Senior Women**

- maximum of 7 jump elements (one of which must be an Axel type jump);
- maximum of 3 spins, one of which must be a spin combination, one a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance and one a spin with only one position;
- maximum of 1 step sequence;
- maximum of 1 choreographic sequence.

#### **Junior Men**

- maximum of 7 jump elements (one of which must be an Axel type jump);  
maximum of 3 spins, one of which must be a spin combination, one a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance and one a spin with only one position; maximum of 1 choreographic sequence.

#### **Junior Women**

- maximum of 7 jump elements (one of which must be an Axel type jump);
- maximum of 3 spins, one of which must be a spin combination, one a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance and one a spin with only one position;
- maximum of 1 choreographic sequence.

### **Short Program Pairs**

The Short Program for pairs (Senior and Junior) consists of seven (7) required elements. The sequence of the elements is optional. No extra marks are obtained by extending the program to the maximum time allowed if this is unnecessary. The music is chosen by each pair, vocal music with lyrics is permitted.

#### **Senior Pairs**

- a) Any hand to hand lift take-off (Group Four);
- b) Twist lift (double or triple);
- c) Throw jump (double or triple);
- d) Solo jump (double or triple);

- e) Solo spin combination with only one change of foot;
- f) Death spiral backward outside;
- g) Step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

### **Junior Pairs**

- a) Any hand to hand lift take-off (Group Four);
- b) Twist lift (double or triple);
- c) Double or triple Salchow throw jump;
- d) Double Flip or double Axel solo jump ;
- e) Solo spin combination with only one change of foot;
- f) Death spiral backward outside;
- g) Step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface

### **Free Skating Pair**

The Pairs Free Skating consists of a well-balanced program composed and skated to music of the pair's own choice for a specified period of time. Vocal music with lyrics is permitted. A good program contains moves of Single Skating executed simultaneously either symmetrically (mirror skating) or in parallel (shadow skating) and especially typical Pair Skating moves such as pair spins, spirals, lifts, partner assisted jumps and the like, linked harmoniously by steps and other movements.

### **Senior Well-Balanced Program**

- maximum of 3 lifts, not all from the same group, with full extension of the lifting arm/s;
- maximum of 1 twist lift;
- maximum of 2 different throw jumps;
- maximum of 1 solo jump;
- maximum of 1 jump combination or sequence;
- maximum of 1 pair spin combination;
- maximum of 1 death spiral different from the death spiral of the Short Program;
- maximum of 1 choreographic sequence.

### **Junior Well-Balanced Program**

- maximum of 2 lifts, not all from the same group with full extension of the lifting arm/s;
- maximum of 1 twist lift;
- maximum of 2 different throw jumps;
- maximum of 1 solo jump;
- maximum of 1 jump combination or sequence;
- maximum of 1 pair spin combination;
- maximum of 1 death spiral;
- maximum of 1 choreographic sequence.

Any additional element or elements exceeding the prescribed numbers will not be counted in the result of a pair. Only the first attempt (or allowed number of attempts) of an element will be taken into account.

### Rhythm Dance

In accordance with the [Special Regulations & Technical Rules for Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2024](#), Rule 502 and all pertinent ISU Communications. Duration of two (2) minutes and fifty (50) seconds, plus or minus 10 seconds.

#### **Rhythm Dance Theme Junior and Senior:**

The theme selected for the Rhythm Dances for both Junior and Senior for the season 2024/25 is “Social Dances and Styles from the 1950s, 1960s and 1970s”.

The Rhythm Dance for the 2024/2025 season takes inspiration from the high energy and entertaining dance styles from these decades. Remixed and/or remastered music, including cover versions, is permitted. The couple should demonstrate through dance movements/dance holds the feeling/essence and dance style(s) from these decades.

Note: To comply with the ethical values of sports, any music chosen for Ice Dance competitions must not include aggressive and/or offending lyrics.

#### **Pattern Dance Element Senior:**

One (1) Pattern Dance Type Step Sequence (Style D)

Rhythm: skated to any dance style – min 110 beats per min, in 2/2, 2/4 or 4/4 time

Choreographic Rhythm Sequence skated to any dance style

The Choreographic Rhythm Sequence is evaluated as a Choreographic Element.

#### **Pattern Dance Element Junior:**

Two (2) Sequences of the Paso Doble skated/Performed to any dance style (Social Dances of the 1950s, 60s, 70s) with the range of tempo: 56 measures of 2 beats per minute (112 beats per minute plus or minus 2 beats per minute.) The first step of the dance must be skated on beat one of a musical phrase. The two sequences of the Paso Doble may be skated in any order, one after the other separately.

#### **Specifications:**

The description, chart and diagrams of the Pattern Dances are included in the [ISU Handbook Ice Dance for Technical Panel 2023/24](#).

#### **Required Elements Junior and Senior:**

1. One (1) Short Lift (up to 8 seconds)
2. One (1) Step Sequence Not Touching (Style B)
3. One (1) Set of Sequential Twizzles

At least two Twizzles for each partner and must NOT be in contact between Twizzles

Set of Sequential Twizzles is evaluated as one unit by adding the Base Values of the Woman Set of Twizzles Level and Man Set of Twizzles Level and then applying the GOE

### Free Dance

Rule 710, paragraph 2 provides that the list of Required Elements to be included in a Well-Balanced Free Dance Program and the specific requirements for these elements are announced annually from the list of options provided in this Rule. For the season

2024/25, the Ice Dance Technical Committee adopted the following specific Required Elements to be included in a Well-Balanced Free Dance Program.

**Required Elements Junior and Senior:**

**1) Dance Lifts (no more than):**

Junior:

- a) Two Different Type Short Lift (up to 8 seconds)  
Or
- b) One Combination Lift (up to 13 seconds)

Senior:

- a) Three Different Type Short Lift (up to 8 seconds)  
Or
- b) One Short Lift and one Combination Lift up to 13 seconds (Short Lift must be different type than in the Combination Lift)

**2) One Dance Spin**

**3) One Step Sequence – Types: Straight Line or Curve**

- a) One Step Sequence in Hold (Style B)

Not permitted: Stops, Loops, Retrogression, Hand in hand hold with fully extended arms cannot be established, Separations of more than 2 arm lengths and/or exceeding 5 seconds.

The pattern of the Step Sequence (Style B) must maintain the integrity or basic shape of the chosen pattern and must be a different shape than the pattern of the Choreographic Step Sequence if chosen as a Choreographic Element.

**4) One Foot Turns Sequence, Not-Touching**

One Foot Turns Sequence is evaluated as one unit by adding the Base Values of the Woman One Foot Turns Sequence and Man One Foot Turns Sequence and then applying the GOE.

**5) Synchronized Twizzles**

- a) One Set of Synchronized Twizzles

- i) At least two Twizzles for each partner, with a minimum 2 steps and up to 4 steps between 1st and 2nd Twizzles. (Each push and/or transfer of weight while on two feet between Twizzles is considered as a step)
- ii) Partners must be in contact at some point between the 1st and 2nd Twizzles

Set of Synchronized Twizzles is evaluated as one unit by adding the Base Values of the Woman Set of Twizzles and Man Set of Twizzles and then applying the corresponding GOE.

**6) Choreographic element**

For Juniors two/for Seniors three different Choreographic Elements chosen from:

- Choreographic Lift
- Choreographic Spinning Movement
- Choreographic Assisted Jump/Lifting Movement
- Choreographic Twizzling Movement

Choreographic Sliding Movement  
Choreographic Character Step Sequence  
Choreographic Hydroblading Movement

## ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Season 2024/25



The Skaters are seeded and invited to the six Grand Prix of Figure Skating events based on the results of the ISU World Figure Skating Championships 2024. Skaters/couples who have placed 1 to 6 in each of the four categories are seeded and assigned to two events. Skaters/ couples who have placed 7-12 at the ISU World Figure Skating Championships are selected for two ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating events, and skaters with a top 24 Seasonal Best Scores (from the 2023/24 season) as well as those placed in the top 24 of the World Standings can also be invited. If available medalists from the ISU World Junior Figure Skating Championships and the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final gold medalists can also be selected.

In order for a skater/couple to be eligible to compete at an ISU Grand Prix event, a minimum total score must have been achieved in the previous season in an ISU event (Grand Prix, Junior Grand Prix, Championships) or a Challenger Series event. Exceptions apply to host country skaters, previously ranked skaters or split ranked couples who return with new partners.

The minimum total score is 3/5 of highest score per discipline at the ISU World Figure Skating Championships 2024 and are as follows: Women: 133.77, Men: 200.26, Pairs: 132.93, Ice Dance: 133.32.

## History of jumps in Figure Skating

There are six different jumps in Figure Skating that are performed in competition:

### Axel

The Axel is named after Norwegian Figure Skater Axel Paulsen. As it has a forward takeoff but lands backwards, an Axel actually has half an extra rotation (i.e. a single Axel is 1.5 revolutions, a double is 2.5 revolutions, a triple is 3.5 revolutions). The first single Axel ever to be performed was by Paulsen in 1882 in Vienna (outside of competition). Sonja Henie (NOR) became the first female Skater to perform an Axel in competition in the early 1920s. Richard Button (USA) completed the first double Axel at the 1948 Olympic Winter Games.

### Flip

The flip is a toe jump that takes off from a back inside edge and lands on the back outside edge of the opposite foot. The origins of the jump are not well documented and the inventor is not known for certain, however it is possible that Bruce Mapes (USA) created the jump.

### Loop (Rittberger)

The loop is a jump that takes off from a back outside edge and lands on the same backwards outside edge. It is believed that the jump was created by Werner Rittberger (GER), in fact in German and Russian, the jump is known as "Rittberger".

### Lutz

The Lutz is a toe-pick assisted jump with an entrance from a back outside edge and landing on the back outside edge of the opposite foot. The jump is named after Austrian Figure Skater Alois Lutz, who performed it in 1913.

### Salchow

The Salchow is an edge jump with a takeoff from a back inside edge of one foot and its landing is made on the back outside edge of the foot opposite. The jump was invented and named after Ulrich Salchow (SWE) in 1909.

### Toeloop

The toeloop is a toe jump that takes off and lands on the same backward outside edge. It was invented in the 1920s by Bruce Mapes (USA).
