The Tallinn Open 2026 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution 2025, Competition & Event Regulations 2026, Sports Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2026, Sport Rules Synchronized Skating and the relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in Tallinn Open 2026 is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Competition & Event Regulations 2026, Article 7.2, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Article 9.3.1, and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirement in Article 8 and ISU Communication 2526 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Article 8 and ISU Communication 2526, all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

REGISTRATION OF ENTRIES

All entries to the Tallinn Open 2026 should be submitted by clubs, which are members of National Figure Skating Federations, associated with the ISU

Each club may enter any number competitors in each category (males and females). In case of too many entries, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to limit the number of participants.

All Members who are entering competitors first time to the Sportity Online Registration System, must contact Sportity Ltd. by email **info@sportity.com** with the Members' (Clubs) Country, Organisation Legal Name, National Registry code, contact e-mail address. Please ensure you have enough time to create an initial account. The process might take up to 24 hours.

The **"Planned Program Content"** will be submitted in the Sportity Online Registration System. It is mandatory that the Program Content is filled in precisely by each Skater/team in English using the terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication

Registration deadlines

Preliminary entry forms, Competitors and Judges entries must be submitted by **August 20, 2026** at the latest.

Entries that are sent/received after the mentioned deadline will not be accepted.

ENTRY FEE

ENTRY FEE (paid before August 20, 2026):

90 EUR for the skaters with free program
110 EUR for the skaters with short and free program
140 EUR for Pairs and Ice dance couples

Late Entry fee (paid after August 20, 2026):

100 EUR for the skaters with free program
120 EUR for the skaters with short and free program
150 EUR for Pairs and Ice dance couples

Each club has to pay 100% of the total amount for its participants right after the entry form confirmation, but not later than August 25, 2026. The competitor is included in the entry list only after a 100% payment and from that moment can only be substituted by another skater if an emergency cancellation occurs. Entry fees are not refunded.

- ✓ We kindly ask the clubs to make one payment for all its participants.
- ✓ Please ensure that we receive the net amount of the required payment sum.
- ✓ Please add the club's name and number of skaters to transfer explanation
- ✓ All registration-related procedures (registration, annulment, changes) must be submitted to the Event Coordinator in written form.
- ✓ In case a skater has been entered in the competition, but cannot participate, she/he can be replaced by another skater in the same category and class.
- ✓ Participating teams should inform of any changes in their team as soon as possible, but not later than **September 1, 2026**
- ✓ **Please note that the entry fee is non-refundable after the deadline, regardless of the reason for withdrawal.** The Organizing Committee reserves the right to withdraw entries for skaters who have not paid the entry fee by the deadline.

AWARDS

Three first standings of each category/class shall be awarded with medal and a special prize

The title “Tallinn champion” will receive the best Tallinn skater/pair/couple in the following categories: Basic Novice, Intermediate Novice, Advanced Novice, Junior and Senior in Single skating; Advanced Novice in Pairs and Ice Dance and Junior in Synchronized skating.

All award ceremonies will be held at the ice rink approx. 1 hour after the end of their respective segments.

MUSIC

All Competitors shall furnish competition music of excellent quality on USB drive in any other approved format, in accordance with Rule 343, paragraph 2. A list of titles, composers and orchestras of the music to be used for the Short Program and Free Skating Program for Single and Pairs, must be entered on the ISU Portal. Members can download the entered information to send to the Organizing Committee.

The Competitor’s music should be submitted to the Organizing Committee through the Sportity Online Registration System (<https://fs.sportity.com/>) by latest 25 of August 2026.

The submission must be of a fine quality encoded in either MP3 or WAW format with normalized level audio. The OC cannot guarantee quality playback for music submitted in other than the above-mentioned format. Each music submission must also contain the name of the track, composer, singer and/or author in the Title field of the Online Registration form.

The rights in the music and choreography presented and used by the Competitor for their performance should be fully cleared and acquired on a transferable basis from the individual rights owners for public use.

RESULTS

The marking system (ISU Judging System) as described in ISU Sports Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2026, Rule 352 and Rule 353 be used.

COMPETITION SCHEDULE

Preliminary schedule will be available after September 1st, 2026 in the Sportity App

Starting Order Draws

An electronic Opening draw will be done on September 9. The starting orders and the final time schedule shall be published in the Sportity Application.

RESPONSIBILITY

In accordance with the ISU Competition and Event Regulations, Rule 16.2, all participants act at their own Responsibility.

PROTESTS

A protest must be submitted in writing to the category referee. If the referee is not available, the protest should be submitted via email to the competition office, who will forward it to the referee. (ISU Competition and Event Regulations, Rule 15.1). Protests based on an alleged violation of rules may be lodged provided they are not excluded by this or any other rule. The Referee decides upon all protests. Protests must be filed with the Referee in writing and within the stated time limit.

No protests against evaluations by Referees, Judges and the Technical Panel (Technical Controller, Technical Specialists) of Skaters' performances are permitted.

Protests against results are permitted only in the case of incorrect mathematical calculation. A wrong identification of an element or of a level of difficulty, although it results in a lower or higher score is not an incorrect mathematical calculation

The cost of submitting a protest is €50, which must be paid at the time of submission. If the protest is upheld, the fee will be refunded. Otherwise, the protest fee will remain with the competition organizer.

EXPENSES

Competitors and all other Team Members are responsible for their own travel, accommodation and meal expenses.

LIABILITY

In accordance with Article 17.3, it is the sole obligation of each Member participating in ISU Events, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious. It is an internal matter of each ISU Member to decide the issue who shall pay the premium for such insurance.
