1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The **ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating - Batumi 2026** will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution 2025, Competition & Event Regulations 2026, the Sports Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2026, and the relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the **ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating - Batumi 2026** is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Article 7.2, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Article 9.3.2, and they meet the participation, citizenship, and residency requirements in Article 8 and ISU Communication 2526 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Article 8 of the ISU Competition & Event Regulations 2026 and ISU Communication 2526, all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

All competitors must be entered through their respective ISU Member.

With reference to the Announcement of the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating 2026/27, the list of ISU Members invited for participation with the quota in each discipline, as mentioned in the annex of this announcement, must be observed.

2. TECHNICAL DATA

3. ENTRIES

3.1 Entries by Name

3.1.1 General

All Entries must be made by the Member concerned based on the charts available in the General Announcement for the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating 2026/27.

All entries for ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating Events must be done through the **ISU Online Registration System (ORS)** by the deadline indicated. Hotel and travel information should also be entered into ORS, as well as bank information. Declarations will need to be uploaded to the ORS as well.

3.1.2 Entries of Competitors

The Entries by names must be made via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS):

not later than **Friday, August 21, 2026 – 20:00 (local time Batumi)**.

Skaters entering the Junior Grand Prix circuit for the first time and/or new Ice Dance couples must send to the ISU Office (entries@isu.org) a copy of their passport at the time of the above-mentioned entry deadline.

Please observe the restrictions concerning the selection of Competitors within the events of the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating" (see also General Announcement for the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating 2026/27).

3.1.3 Entries of Judges

Each participating ISU Member may nominate one (1) judge. A second Judge can only be entered if the Member has entries in one Figure Skating discipline and in Ice Dance. It is recommended that the second Judge, if possible, has the qualifications for Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance. The Host Member may nominate a judge in each discipline in which they have entries.



Please observe the restrictions concerning the selection of Judges within the events of the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating 2026/27, that no Judge may serve in more than two (2) ISU Junior Grand Prix events.

The Entries of Judges must be made via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS) and reach the Organizing Committee and the ISU Office, not later than **Friday, August 21, 2026 – 20:00 (local time Batumi)**.

Each panel of Judges will consist of a maximum of 9 Judges, but with a minimum of 7 Judges, if possible. In exceptional cases and if there is no possibility to compose a panel of judges with at least 7 Judges, the ISU Vice-President Figure Skating could amend this paragraph. However, there should never be fewer than 5 Judges.

The ISU Event Management Team, together with the Organizing Committee, in consultation with the ISU Vice-President Figure Skating, may reduce the number of Judges per ISU Member if there is a possibility that entered Judges will not be guaranteed to judge the event in which they have been entered.

In case that at the time of the Judges' draw, more Judges will be available and entered as required to compose the panels of nine (9) Judges in one or more disciplines, the ISU Event Management Team, together with the Organizing Committee, will conduct the draw for nine (9) Judges for the first segment. The Judges, not drawn for the first segment, will be seated for the second segment.

The panel for the second segment (Free Skating / Free Dance) will, in this case, be completed by an open draw amongst the Judges serving in the first segment of the discipline in question.

3.1.4 Entries of Team Members

Official entries of Team Leaders, Assistant Team Leaders, Coaches, Team Officials, Team Medical Staff, and Member Press Officer (if applicable), and the partner or relative of a Judge will be accepted. Accreditation will be provided to those who are officially accepted by the Organizer/ISU in ORS.

Please be advised that only one Coach per Skater will be accredited. An Assistant Team Leader will be accepted for Teams having six (6) or more Skaters. Only two (2) Team Officials of each Member, including the Member President, provided that they are Council Members, Technical Committee Members, or Members of the Head Office of their Federation, will be accredited. Not more than one (1) Team Doctor and one (1) Team Physiotherapist will be accepted as the Team Medical Staff, for which the organizer requests the right to have a medical certification (document) presented before accreditation. An accompanying person to a Judge will only be accepted for accreditation if this person is a life partner or a relative of the Judge. The ISU Member guarantees that the requested accreditation of Team Members will correspond to their function within the team and the Federation.

Chaperones will also be accepted: a maximum of one (1) per skater entered. ISU Members will need to indicate the relation between the chaperone and the entered skater. Only family members or direct relations will be accepted as Chaperones.

The names of all team members must be submitted via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS) and must reach the Organizing Committee and the ISU Office not later than **Friday, August 21, 2026 – 20:00 (local time Batumi)**.

4. MEALS, LODGING, and TRAVEL EXPENSES

The organizer will provide and cover the expenses for rooms and meals for all Competitors and Judges participating, beginning with dinner on **Tuesday, September 22, 2026** until breakfast on **Sunday, September 27, 2026**.

Should any Competitor or Judge arrive at the hotel before or stay longer than the period described above, their room costs and expenses will be the responsibility of the individual and must be paid on arrival.

The organizer will provide and cover the expenses for rooms and meals, also for the Referees, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists, and the Data & Replay Operators. If any longer period is agreed upon with the Organizing Committee, the period of coverage will be prolonged as agreed.



All extra expenses incurred by any Team Member or any kind of Official will be the responsibility of that person and must be paid before departure.

The Judges, the Referees, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists, and the Data & Replay Operators will receive remuneration in accordance with ISU Communication No. 2096, paragraph 1, a (or any update of this Communication). Only hard currencies are acceptable. The remuneration will be paid upon accreditation. The ISU will reimburse the total relevant costs upon receipt of an invoice stating the number (including names) of the acting officials and their signatures.

5. PRACTICE

Official practice for Competitors begins on **Wednesday, September 23, 2026**. The detailed schedule will be issued at the time of registration.

6. MUSIC / PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

In accordance with Rule 343 in the ISU Sports Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2026, the following method to submit the Competitor's music to the Organizing Committee must be followed:

- the ISU Member is responsible for submitting their Competitor's music as a direct attachment to an email to the Organizing Committee (<https://www.dropbox.com/request/xk3g3fcf30pewjp0pf2d>) until **September 23, 2026** (one week prior to competition).

Please note: some music files might exceed the size of a regular email. In this case, an email-based transfer service which allows to send large files could be used to send the file to the OC.

- each submission shall be labelled with the name of the ISU Member, name of the category, segment, and the name(s) of the competitor(s):

- the music files must be sent as **WAV or MP3** file formats. Any other format is not acceptable.

Please note: Files in MP3 format may have a significant difference in the music quality when reproduced. The Organizing Committee in this case is not responsible if the music quality is insufficient.

- Each Competitor must have their own backup drive (USB Stick) for each program in the format of a WAV or MP3 file.
- The exact running time of the music (not skating time) must be communicated to the Organizing Committee when submitting the music and shall be certified by the Competitor/Coach/Team Leader at the time of registration.
- During the 1st Official Practice, the music will be played as indicated in the Practice Schedule and will allow to verify the correctness of the submitted music. If there is an issue with the music, the Team Leader/Coach may be allowed to change the music by presenting an acceptable reproduction to the Organizing Committee's Music Team (USB Stick with file format of WAV or MP3 file).

If the music files have been submitted within the above-mentioned deadline to the Organizing Committee, then the music team of the Organizing Committee is entirely responsible for the correct execution of the music. In case of issues with submitted music files, the Organizing Committee may request, at the time of registration, a secondary copy of the music files. In case the music files have not been submitted in time to the Organizing Committee, the skater(s) must present their music at the latest at the time of registration on the above-defined means and in the defined format.

Please note: CDs will **not** be accepted by the Organizing Committee.



ISU Members/Skaters are reminded that, for them to use music to accompany their routines, the following 'Music Accompaniment' rights/licenses are required:

- the right to edit or adapt music into a mix, if more than one song is being used.
- the right to set choreography to the music, often referred to as a 'Grand Right', which is the right to perform musical compositions and recordings within the context of a "dramatic work" or choreography.
- the right to create any copies of the music that may be needed for training and competition purposes, also known as the 'mechanical rights'.

For a music to be fully cleared for these uses, these rights need to be cleared for each and every track used in each mix that contains a license (backed by a warranty and legal indemnity) for appropriate territory(s) that covers both the master rights of the recording artist and the publishing rights of each individual writer and composer of the track.

There are several ways in which ISU Members and their Skaters can legally use or create a music mix to accompany their routine/performance:

1. For easy compliance with the above-mentioned requirements, it is recommended to use commercially released or production music which has been pre-cleared, such as from ClicknClear.com.
2. Use completely original music (specially commissioned) written and/or recorded by a AI, composer and/or artist. If you do this, please ensure you have contractually obtained the relevant rights required. ClicknClear's License Verification System has an online form that your composer/artist can use to confirm the rights they have granted you.
3. Use music out of copyright (otherwise known as music in the public domain). To be noted that the duration of copyright varies in each country, so ISU Members **MUST** check their local copyright law.
4. Secure a license directly from the owners of the music that the Skaters would like to use. In some cases, ClicknClear may be able to assist in the clearance of music not currently available on the ClicknClear platform. However, please note this route will be significantly more expensive, may take significant time, and there is no guarantee of a positive outcome.

The Planned Program Content must also be entered by the ISU Member or the Skater(s) on the dedicated ISU platform. It is mandatory that the Program Content information be filled in precisely by each Skater/Team in English using the terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

7. ARRIVAL OF PARTICIPANTS / TEAMS

All ISU Members are requested to announce to the Organizing Committee as soon as possible, but not later than **Friday, August 21, 2026**, the name of the airlines, flight numbers, dates, and times of arrival of their participants. The detailed travel information needs to be submitted via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS).

The nearest airport to **Batumi** are **Alexander Kartveli Batumi International Airport** and **Kutaisi International Airport** with a distance of **8 km** and **140km** to the official hotel. The Organizing Committee provides a bus shuttle to meet the teams on arrival. Please accept that the Organizing Committee has to ask for a small transportation fee from all persons participating in this shuttle service. Please inform the Organizing Committee, together with your entry, whether you will be using the transportation offered.

8. OFFICIAL HOTEL

Hotel information will be available in the First Information document, which will be forwarded to the ISU Members at the time of publication of this Announcement. Hotel capacities can only be booked via the Organizing Committee. Hotel reservation requests need to be submitted via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS).



9. ACCREDITATION

The ISU Member certifies with the entries in ORS the indicated functions within the team of all team members. Any misuse of any function will be sanctioned by the ISU/OC.

Accreditation will be given to appointed ISU Event Officials, ISU Office Holders, Guests, and those mentioned in 3.1.4.

Chaperons will not receive accreditation. The Team Leader may request "bus permits" for the official registered Chaperons to join the official shuttle bus system of the Organizing Committee.

10. RESULTS

The marking system (ISU Judging System) as described in ISU Sports Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2026, Rule 352 and Rule 353 (Determination and publication of results) will be used.

11. PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The three best-placed Skaters/Couples in each event will be announced and honored. Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be presented to the medalists. The national anthem of the winners will be played, and the flags of the medal winners hoisted.

12. POINTS FOR "ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating"

Points will be awarded as follows:

1 st place	15 points
2 nd place	13 points

The points received are of value for the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating and the qualification for the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final.

If a Skater/Couple does not complete an event due to illness or injury, this event will be treated as "not skated", i.e. the result(s) of the initial round(s) completed will not count for the ISU Junior Grand Prix ranking order. However, such an event will count as one (1) participation, but without receiving credit in the ranking order. Only a second participation in another "ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating event" is possible.

13. PRIZE MONEY

Prize Money will be awarded to each medal winner for each category. The exact amounts will be announced in due course and a dedicated ISU Communication will be released latest by August 1, 2026.

The individual prize money will be transferred to the ISU Member concerned immediately after the conclusion of the event.

The prize money may be reduced or completely withheld if a Skater/Couple:

- does not participate in the final exhibition gala of the Event concerned with at least one exhibition number (show dance or similar) plus an encore if so requested (not completed or fractures of programs are not considered to be sufficient. Any competitive program as performed during the



competition or a part of a competition program in another costume or skated to another music is also not considered a “show dance”) if any is organized.

- ii) does not attend the press conference after his/her/their event if any is organized.
- iii) does not take part in social events if asked by the ISU and/or the organizer.

The decision to reduce or withhold the prize money can only be made by the ISU Grand Prix Coordination Group in consultation and with the agreement of the ISU Coordinator for the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating. The withholding taxes, if any, will be deducted according to the individual government's law.

14. ISU WORLD STANDINGS

World Standing points will also be awarded according to the “ISU World Standings Procedure”, which can be found on the ISU website (www.isu-skating.com) under Figure Skating / Results / World Standings.

15. ANTI-DOPING CONTROLS

Anti-Doping tests will be carried out according to the ISU Anti-Doping Rules and ISU Anti-Doping Procedures, as given in the applicable ISU Communications (ISU Communications No. 2742 or later updates).

16. INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Article 17.3 of the Competition & Event Regulations 2026, it is the sole obligation of each Member participating in ISU Events to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials, and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means. It is an internal matter of each ISU Member to decide the issue of who shall pay the premium for such insurance. The ISU assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred by Competitors and Officials.

17. EXHIBITION

There will be **NO** Exhibition at the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating - Batumi 2026.

18. MEETINGS FOR ISU EVENT OFFICIALS and JUDGES

The Initial Judges Meeting and Judges Draw will be held one (1) day prior to the first competition.

Please see the dates and times for all other official meetings for Technical Panels (before and after the respective event), Referees and Technical Controllers Meeting, and Judges Round Table Discussions in paragraph 20. Schedule of Events.

For the initial Technical Panel Meetings per discipline the exact times will be announced only after the practice schedule has been completed. However, all initial Technical Panel Meetings will be held during the first practice day and will be adjusted to the practice schedule of each discipline.

ISU Event Officials and Judges are responsible for making their travel arrangements in order to be able to attend the respective meetings. If any other party makes the flight arrangements, the ISU Event Officials and the Judges are responsible for checking if such arrangements are in line with the detailed schedule as mentioned under paragraph 20.
