GENERAL REGULATIONS

The Neuchâtel Trophy 2026 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2024, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules for Synchronized Skating 2024 as well as applicable ISU Communications. The ages must be within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 4. All skaters must qualify regarding eligibility according to Rule 102 and participation and citizenship requirements according to Rule 109. Teams which have participated in the ongoing season in a competition of a certain category are not allowed to take part in another category at the Neuchâtel Trophy 2026.

CATEGORIES

ISU categories

Senior ISU / Senior Elite 12

At least 17 years before July 1, 2025.

16 skaters (Senior Elite 12: 12 skaters) with a maximum of 4 alternates.

Short Program 2 minutes and 50 seconds but may be less.

Free Skating 4 minutes (+/- 10 sec).

Well Balanced Program Content according to Communication 2692 Senior.

Junior ISU

At least 13 years and have not reached the age of 19 before July 1, 2025.

12 to 16 skaters with a maximum of 4 alternates.

Short Program 2 minutes and 50 seconds but may be less.

Free Skating 3 minutes 30 seconds (+/- 10 sec).

Well Balanced Program Content according to Communication 2692 Junior.

Advanced Novice

At least 10 years and have not reached the age of 16 before July 1, 2025.

12 to 16 skaters with a maximum of 4 alternates.

Free Skating 3 minutes (+/- 10 sec).

Well Balanced Program Content according to Communication 2692 Advanced Novice.

Commission and/or fees for bank transactions must be paid directly to the bank in addition to the entry fee at the time of the bank transfer.

The entry fee does not include transport or extra practice ice. It will not be refunded in case of withdrawal for any reason.

OFFICIALS

Each participating ISU member entering at least one (1) team may enter **one (1) international judge or ISU judge for Synchronized Skating** from the official ISU list of judges of the current season.

The **Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists** and **Data/Replay Operators** will be invited by the Organizing Committee

The Organizing Committee will cover travel expenses at APEX (advance purchase excursion) airfare economy rates for all invited Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists and Data/Replay Operators. **Travel expenses of the Judges are borne by their respective ISU Member or by themselves.** Furthermore, the Organizing Committee will provide ground transportation in Neuchâtel, as well as accommodation and meals, from Thursday, March 5, 2026, dinner to Sunday, March 8, 2026, breakfast. All other expenses will be the responsibility of each individual Official. Should any Official arrive at the hotel before or stay after the period described above, their room costs and expenses will be their own responsibility and must be paid upon arrival. The Organizing Committee does not cover travel, accommodation and meal expenses for any other relatives.

The Official Hotel is located within walking distance (approx. 15 minutes) of the Ice Rink. The Organizing Committee can however provide transport between the hotel and the Ice Rink. Please indicate on the form if interested.

All Referees, Judges and Members of the Official Team Delegation taking part in the Neuchâtel Trophy 2026 are requested to submit the details of their trip to the Organizing Committee as soon as possible, but no later than the final date of entry.

ACCOMMODATION FOR TEAMS

Accommodation for participating Teams is at their own expense. A list of hotels that support the Neuchâtel Trophy 2026 will be published on the competition website. You can also find other hotels on <https://www.j3l.ch/en/Z11061/accomodation-neuchatel-region>.

When booking your hotels, please mention that you are participating to the Neuchâtel Trophy 2026. Some hotels pre-book rooms for the participants of the competition and therefore say they are “fully booked” if they do not know who the booking is for. The assumption of any cancellation costs is the responsibility of each Team.

TRANSPORTATION

It is the responsibility of all participating Teams to **organize and cover the costs of their journey to and back from Neuchâtel**, which should include the transfer to and from the airport, or any transportation to Neuchâtel and back as well as within Neuchâtel from the Hotel to the skating rink and back.

For all Teams staying in the Canton of Neuchâtel, public transport will be free for the duration of the stay. If requested, the Organizing Committee will assist with further information regarding transfer within Neuchâtel. Please contact teamrelations@neuchatel-trophy.ch.

REGISTRATION SERVICE

A reception service for accreditation will be provided in the Main Arena for participating Teams and Event Officials. All registered skaters must enclose a **copy of their passport** (in alphabetical order) when they sign in, as passports copies must be collected for the referee of the competition.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT SHEET

The Planned Program Content Sheet must be forwarded to the Organizing Committee by the final date of entry at the latest. It must be signed by a coach or Team Representative. However, the programs' content may be changed at the time of registration. Changed Program Content Sheets must be handed over to the Registration desk. **It is not permitted to hand over the Program Content Sheets directly to acting Officials.**

EXTRA PRACTICE ICE

Additional practice sessions will be available on Wednesday, March 4, 2026, and Thursday, March 5, 2026, at the rate of CHF 120.00 per 30 minutes and will be granted in the order of arrival of the bookings. Block bookings may be subject to modification to allow all competitors the opportunity of having extra practice ice. No extra practice ice will be permitted after the Official Draw.

MUSIC

All Teams shall provide competition music of excellent quality in MP3 format by email to music@neuchatel-trophy.ch. We would be grateful to receive your music in advance (no later than **February 8, 2026**).

The MP3 files, one file per program, shall be named
<Program>_<category>_<country abbreviation>_<Team name>.mp3
For example: Short_Senior_SUI_Team_Cool_Dreams_Junior.mp3.

A list of titles, composers, and orchestras of the music to be used for the Short Program and Free Skating must be listed for each Team on the Music Selection Form.

In accordance with Rule 823, paragraph 2, all Teams must announce the exact running time of the music (not skating time) including any starting signal, which shall be certified by the Team Coach, Team Manager or Team Leader at the time of accreditation.

In addition, Teams must provide at accreditation a back-up for each program (Short Program and Free Skating). Each program must be recorded in MP3 format on a separate USB stick. The USB stick shall be formatted for Windows (NTFS, FAT32 or exFAT) with only the MP3 file of the program in the main (root) directory, without other files or directories.

If music information is not complete and/or the music is not provided, accreditation will not be given.

The music files will be deleted by the organizers shortly after the competition. The backup USB sticks will be returned to the Teams.

OFFICIAL PRACTICE

The Official Practice will be held in the Main Arena.

The music will start:

- In the practice of 10 minutes: after 1:30 minute and after 6:00 minutes

- In the practice of 12 minutes: after 1:30 minute and after 7:00 minutes

OFF-ICE WARM-UP

Off-ice warm-up areas are located near the ice rink (3 minutes' walk).

DRAWS – STARTING ORDER

ISU categories

The Official Draw will take place on Thursday, March 5, 2026, at the arena.

The draw for the Free Skating of the categories Junior ISU, Senior ISU and Senior Elite 12 will be the reverse order of places in the Short Program, as allowed by the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Synchronized Skating, Rule 963, paragraph 2.

OPENING AND AWARD CEREMONY

The details will be communicated later.

INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole obligation of each ISU Member participating in the competition, as defined in Rule 107, to provide medical and accident insurance for his Athletes, Officials, and all other Members of the ISU Member's Team(s). Such insurance must provide full medical coverage as well as the return journey of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means. Swiss Ice Skating and the Organizing Committee assume no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred in connection with the event by Competitors and Officials. The Organizer will not provide participant insurance coverage for the event. The Organizer will provide emergency medical services for all Competitors during the competition and Official Practice sessions at the Official Ice rink. The local hospital is within 5 minutes distance from the Ice Rink.

PUBLICITY WAIVER

Members, Officials, Teams, and competitors hereby acknowledge and consent to the fact that Team photos, Team information and results will be published, as well as that the Neuchâtel Trophy 2026, in Neuchâtel, Switzerland, may be televised or live streamed either in whole or in part, for showing on a worldwide basis. All Competitors and Teams hereby certify and warrant that the music and choreography presented and used have been fully cleared and authorized for public use and consent to the use of their name, biography and likeness on or in connection with any television or radio program broadcast and re-broadcast throughout the world, motion picture, print media or the advertising and publicizing of such program, without further clearance or payments of any kind on the site of the International Skating Union, the organizing member Swiss Ice Skating, the Organizing Committee and the relevant television network or broadcasters being required.
