British Ice Skating, together with Sheffield Synchronized Skating Academy, are delighted to invite ISU members to the **Steel City Trophy 2026** – an International Synchronized Skating Competition to be in Sheffield, South Yorkshire, Great Britain.

All members of the International Skating Union listed on ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2024 are invited to enter teams at the Steel City Trophy 2026.

THE COMPETITION

The International Steel City Trophy 2026 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution, the ISU General Regulations 2024 and Special Regulations & Technical Rules Synchronized Skating 2024, as well as all applicable ISU Communications.

All skaters must qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102 and participation and citizenship requirements according to Rule 109, for all categories. The final results will be determined according to the ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules Synchronized Skating 2024.

iceSheffield has a seating capacity of 1,500 for the competition, with teams competing on an Olympic-sized ice pad of 60m x 30m. Spectator tickets will be available to purchase online prior to the event, with allocated seating.

The venue is heated, with good changing facilities, a fully licensed bar and hot food on-site.

Coaches: A maximum of two licensed coaches per team may receive rink side accreditation.

The composition of Teams is determined by ISU Rules from SPECIAL REGULATIONS & TECHNICAL RULES SYNCHRONIZED SKATING 2024.

No team may compete in more than one category.

Only skaters whose names are listed on the registration forms will be allowed to skate. Before an Alternate may be substituted into a team, written agreement must be received from the Organizer or Referee.

UK teams must adhere to the BIS Skills (Previously Field Moves) Requirements as set out in the BIS 2025/26 Synchro Criteria.

ENTRY DATES

Entries of Teams, nominated Judges, Team Leaders and Team Managers may only be made by the respective members through the ISU ORS by:

December 19th 2025

Please note: all entry forms for the international competition must be completed via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS)

ENTRY FORMS

This year, teams wishing to enter the Steel City Trophy will need to enter using the **ISU Online Registration System (ORS)**. Entry is open to all teams of ISU members.

Official practices will commence at 06:00am on the morning of Saturday March 7th 2026, unless numbers dictate that practices need to commence the evening before (subject to change).

ISU Senior and Senior Elite 12 Free Program: 12 Minutes

ISU Junior Free Program: 11 Minutes

ISU Senior, Senior Elite 12, and Junior Short Program: 10 Minutes

ISU Advanced Novice: 10 Minutes

Practice times will be notified a few days before the competition commences.



UNOFFICIAL PRACTICE

Requests for unofficial practice ice should be sent to entries@steelcitytrophy.co.uk

Ice is charged at £80 per 15-minute slot. Please include preferred days, time of day (morning, afternoon or evening) and number of slots. While we endeavor to accommodate requests, we cannot guarantee availability and ice will be assigned on a first come basis.

No extra practice ice will be permitted on days of competition as per Special Regulations and Technical Rules Synchronized Skating 2024.

SPECTATORS

Spectators are very welcome at the Steel City Trophy and seated tickets for our 1,500-seat arena will be available to book securely online.

The results will be determined according to the ISU Rules, and ISU regulations will be applied for team composition were published in Special Regulations and Technical Rules Synchronized Skating 2024.

All ISU Categories are as per ISU Communications 2692 & 2689.

All ISU Categories are as per the applicable ISU Communications for the 2025/26 season.

No team may compete in more than one category within each of the two events.

Only those skaters whose names are listed on the registration forms will be allowed to skate. Before an alternate may be substituted into a team the Organizer or Referee must be informed.

Advanced Novice	Free program: 3mins (+/- 10 secs)	Per ISU	12-16 (+4 alts)	Must have reached 10 years but not 16 years before July 1 st 2025.

**In the event of low entry numbers in either Senior or Senior Elite 12, the categories will be combined.*

UK ENTRIES ONLY

BIS licensed coaches wishing to enter skaters into IJS events must have attended the discipline specific IJS seminar at the Coaches Conference/online updates either in 2023, 2024 or 2025 to receive accreditation. Any coach who has not yet attended the Coaches Conference/online updates may not now be accredited. Any IJS seminars prior to 2023 have now expired. A skills seminar also must have been completed prior to the date of the competition.

If coaches named on the application form have not done so, the skater will be given the opportunity to name another coach or remove the coaches' name from their entry. All UK teams must be a paid-up BIS member at the closing date.

MUSIC

ISU Rules as released in 2025 shall apply – see MUSIC RULE 823 from COMMUNICATION No. 2034. You must certify that your music has been fully cleared and authorized for public use and television in the UK as the competition will be streamed online.

The ISWC number and Creator ID reference numbers for each track must be provided on your entry form; you can find them here: <http://bit.ly/ISWCSearch>

You must also provide the PPL (ISCR) reference number for each track – you can check using this website: <http://bit.ly/PPLSearchUK>.

Note: if the track does not have these reference numbers, you must obtain permission from the rights holders to use their track on a broadcast. They may want you to pay for this or they may offer permission free of charge.

Disclaimer – The Steel City Trophy organizing committee, nor the Sheffield Synchronized Skating Academy or its members will be held responsible for your music not being cleared for use online – if your music does not comply, you understand that it may be blocked via the live stream or afterwards.

Music files should be named with the team, name and category entered. Backup music files should be brought to the competition on USB with named tag attached and handed in at registration.

PROGRAMME CONTENT

Your entry form should include Planned Program Content covering Short and Free Programs. Planned Program Content Sheets should be signed by a Coach or Team Representative. However, program content may be changed at the time of the Competition.

JUDGES AND OFFICIALS

The Steel City Trophy will be judged under the IJS system.

The Panel of Judges for each competition will consist of:

1 Referee

Minimum 5 Judges

1 Technical Controller

2 Technical Specialists

The **Referees** will be invited by the Organizing Committee and chosen from the current ISU list of Referees and Judges for ISU International synchronized skating events.

The **Technical Controllers** will be invited by the Organizing Committee and chosen from the current ISU list of Referees and Judges for ISU International synchronized skating events.

The **Technical Specialists** will be invited by the Organizing Committee and chosen from the current ISU list of Technical Specialists for ISU International synchronized skating events.

The **Data/Replay Operators** will be invited by the Organizing Committee and chosen from the current list of Data/Video Replay Operators for ISU International Synchronized Skating or BIS events.

The Organizing Committee will pay travel expenses for the invited Referees, Judges, Technical Controllers (2), Technical Specialists (4), and the Data/Replay Operators only and will provide ground transportation, accommodation and meals throughout the event (from Lunch on Saturday 7th March until breakfast on the morning of departure) for the invited Referees/Technical Controllers/Technical Specialists/ Data-Replay Operators and nominated Judges.

Accommodation will be reserved for all Judges and officials at the nominated official hotel.

International Judges

Each participating ISU member has the right to nominate one (1) judge who has the qualification of “Judge for International Competitions”.

If, in the case of too many nominated judges, the organizing committee will conduct a draw to choose the panel. The result of this draw will be communicated to all concerned ISU members.

The entries for judges are to be made through the ISU ORS no later than the **19th December 2025**.

Travel and accommodation costs for international judges will be at the expense of the ISU member of the country from which they are nominated and not that of the SSSA, the organizing committee for the Steel City Trophy or BIS.

Judges / Referees / Technical Panel Meetings / Round Table Discussion

(All timings are subject to possible change once the final timetable is released)

Draw for ISU categories – Friday 6th March @ 17:00

Initial Judges Meeting – Saturday 7th March, morning prior to the commencement of the competition and at the discretion of the referee.

Round Table Meeting – Sunday 8th March after close of the ISU competition.

All meeting times and locations will be confirmed prior to the event, at the discretion of the Referee and Technical Controller, and will take into account travel arrangements. The Organizing Committee will communicate this information via email to Judges and Officials.

REGISTRATION AND ACCREDITATION

Registration and Accreditation for Referees, Judges, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Data/Replay Operators, Teams, Accredited Coaches, Team Leaders, Team Managers and Chaperones will take place **at the SSSA Desk in the iceSheffield Reception area**. This will be open from 6am Saturday March 7th 2026 and throughout the event.

A maximum of three chaperones/team manager per team will be accepted for the accreditation.

The National Passport or National Identity Card for each skater of the International Teams taking part in the Steel City Trophy 2026 will be checked during the Registration. Any skater who is not a National of the Country for which they are competing must have an ISU release certificate. Teams from Great Britain will be checked by the BIS Office.

OFFICIAL DRAW

The official draw will take place on Friday 6th March at 5pm. The draw will take place in accordance with rule 962 for the Junior & Senior Short Programs and the Advanced Novice Free Program.

The skating order for the Junior and Senior Free Programs will be the reverse order of the results after the short program.

The Results Team will post the skate order on the results link following the draw, and post on the concourse at iceSheffield Ice Arena.

The draw will be made by the Referee(s) in accordance with ISU regulations.

OPENING CEREMONY

The Opening Ceremony will take place at the iceSheffield Ice Arena at the beginning of the competition. Three skaters from each team are invited to take part in the ceremony (please nominate on your entry form) and must be available, ready, and warmed up at rink side 30 minutes before the Opening Ceremony is due to start on each day.

MEDALS AND TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to the team in first place for all categories.

Bespoke designed Steel City Trophy gold, silver and bronze medals will also be presented to all members of teams in first, second and third places respectively.

Presentations will be carried out at the end of each day of the competition, time permitting and dependent the day of the advanced novice category.

CLOSING CEREMONY

The Closing Ceremony will take place at the iceSheffield Ice Arena following the presentation of medals and trophies on each day of the competition, time permitting. All skaters from each team are invited to take part in the ceremony, where a 'flash mob' dance will take place. Full details will be sent out to participating teams in due course.

ORGANISATION

The organization of the competition is the responsibility of British Ice Skating, together with the Sheffield Synchronized Skating Academy. BIS, and the SSSA, reserves the right to take any measures, in agreement with the Referee and Technical Controller, necessary to ensure the smooth running of the event.

LIABILITY

According to ISU Rules and BIS, the Sheffield Synchronized Skating Academy Organizing Committee accepts no liability or responsibility with respect to bodily or personal injury or for property loss or damage incurred by Competitors or Officials in connection with the Steel City Trophy 2026 International Synchronized Skating Competition.

A medical first aid service will be on duty at the ice rink during the competition and at the Official Practices.

DOPING

Anti-doping control testing may be carried out during the competition in accordance with the valid ISU Anti-Doping Code (See ISU Rules and Regulations for 2025) and for the non-ISU events according to the regulation of UK Anti-Doping (UKAD).
