Figure Skating Seminars – Application to hold ISU Seminars for Single & Pair Skating / Ice Dance / Synchronized Skating Referees and Judges in 2024/25 hosted by ISU Members

In accordance with the ISU Regulations, Rule 417, paragraph 1 and Rule 917, paragraph 1, ISU Members may send to the ISU Secretariat, with a copy to the Chair of the respective Technical Committee applications to host ISU Seminars for Single & Pair Skating / Ice Dance / Synchronized Skating, Referees and Judges in 2024/25 (second part of season) fulfilling the characteristics below.

Deadline

The deadline to send the applications to host a seminar from January 1st to June 30th, 2025 is:

- January 15, 2025

An online application form will be forwarded to all interested members.

The deadline to send the applications to host a seminar from July 1st, 2025 to June 30th, 2026 will be announced during the Spring 2025.

Purpose

These ISU Seminars will include a Judges section and a Referees section. They constitute ISU Seminars for re-appointment of International Judges and ISU Judges, re-appointment of International Referees and ISU Referees, and therefore they serve the purposes of the seminar attendance requirements included in Rules 412, paragraphs 1.d) (i), 2.c), 3.d) (i), 4.c), Rule 413, paragraphs 2.c), 4.c) and Rule 900 to 903 and Rule 907.

Moderators

Moderators designated by the respective ISU Technical Committees must conduct these Seminars.

Language

These ISU Seminars will be conducted in English.

Participants

These ISU Seminars are primarily for the Referees and Judges of the Host ISU Member. However, Referees and Judges from other ISU Members (not more than 3 per ISU Member) may also attend subject to the availability of places. The organizing ISU Member may also invite Coaches who are interested in learning and receiving useful information, to attend these ISU Seminars.

The responsibility for the expenses of these ISU Seminars will be allocated as follows:

- a) The administrative expenses (use of ice surface, classroom and all supporting equipment/facilities) will be borne by the Host ISU Member.
- b) The travel and living expenses of the Moderators will be borne by the ISU.
- c) The travel and living expenses of the participants will be borne by their respective ISU Members, or by the ISU Referees/Judges themselves in case of direct application (not through the ISU Members).

The ISU can contribute financially to only a limited number of these ISU Seminars each year. If the ISU is unable to contribute to the expenses of a Seminar and the Host ISU Member holds a seminar following the above guidelines and applied as per the procedure above, the Host ISU Member may nevertheless submit an application for its recognition. If recognition is granted, the total expenditure will then be borne by the Host ISU Member.

ISU Members that do not receive financial assistance from the ISU may apply to their respective NOC for possible funding through Olympic Solidarity.
