The EduSport Trophy will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2024, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2024, and the relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the EduSport Trophy is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2526 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2526 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, <u>must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate</u>.

The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the personal identification documents of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.

Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be sent when registering in the competition, for verification.

By entering, all participants accept that personal data are collected by the Organizing Committee (OC) and such data are stored and used by the OC, and when necessary, third parties, for the purposes only of, and to the extent necessary only in relation to facilitate their participation in the competition; personal data may include but will not be limited to full legal name as per national identity documents, address, date of birth, nationality, sex, etc.

All the members of ISU and Clubs, being members of National Skating Federations associated with ISU, are invited to take part in this competition. Members can enter any number of Skaters into each category. Organizers have the right to refuse or limit the participation in competition. Depending on the number of participants the organizer will decide whether or not to accept extra entries.

For interclub competition, all the entries of skaters and officials, Program Content Sheet, music, passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be uploaded on <u>https://portal.edusporttrophy.org/</u>, when registering the skaters in the competition, until November 25th, 2024. All entries sent after November 25, 2024 are considered as late entries.

For interclub competition, all competitors must be entered through their Club which must be a member of the ISU Member, based on the age and the level of the Skaters.

It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet will be filled precisely for each Skater in English using terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication. It is not permitted to hand over the Program Content Sheets directly to the acting Officials.

Cancellation of the competitor entry, if any, has to be done until November 28, 2024.

Official entries of Team Leaders, Team Officials, Coaches/Choreographers, Team Medical staff etc. must be made together with the entries for Competitors and Judges.

ENTRIES

In accordance with Rule 343 in the ISU Special Regulations Technical Rules Single Pair Skating, the ISU Member/Club is responsible for submitting their Competitor's music as upload on the federation/club account from www.EduSportTrophy.org, until November 25th, 2024.

Each submission must be labelled with the name of the ISU Member, name of the category, segment, the name(s) of the competitor and the exact running time of the music (not skating time). Example:

- ROU_Senior_Men_SP_POPESCU-Andrei-Radu-2min40sec
- ROU_Senior_Men_FS_POPESCU-Andrei-Radu-4min05sec

The music files must be sent only as MP3 file formats. Any other format is not acceptable.

Please note: Files in MP3 format may have a significant difference in the music quality when reproduced. The Organizing Committee in this case is not responsible if the music quality would be insufficient. Each Competitor must have its own back-up drive (USB Stick) for each program in MP3 format. The exact running time of the music (not skating time) must be communicated to the Organizing Committee when submitting the music and shall be certified at the time of registration.

In case the music files have not been submitted in time to the Organizing Committee, the skater(s) must present their music latest at the time of registration on the above defined mean and in the defined format.

If music information is not complete and music not provided, accreditation will not be given.

At accreditation, the music will be played and will allow to verify the correctness of the submitted music. If there is an issue with the music, the Team Leader/Coach may be allowed to change the music by presenting an acceptable reproduction to the Organizing Committee's Music Team (USB Stick with MP3 file)

The Organizer accept no liability for bodily or personal injury, or for property loss or damage incurred by any Competitors or any kind of Officials. It is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in the "EduSport Trophy", to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other persons from the Member's team.

Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means.

It is an internal matter of each ISU Member to decide the issue of who shall pay the premium for such insurance. The Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage in connection incurred by Competitors and Officials.

The Organizing Committee will provide medical emergency aid during competition.

The accreditation will start on December 9th, 2024 at the Allianz-Tiriac Arena Rink.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2526 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, <u>must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate</u>.

The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the personal identification documents of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. <u>Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.</u>

Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be sent when registering in the competition (until November 25, 2024), for verification.

The opening draw for the order of skating for Novice Intermediate, Novice Basic, Cubs, Chicks, Adults and Recreational categories will be held electronically on December 8th, 2024, and will be available on the competition website.

The winners of every category will receive medals and diplomas. All competitors will receive diplomas.

The exact time of the Awarding Ceremonies will be announced in the detailed schedule in due time. Please make sure that all skaters are represented at the Ceremony!

Each ISU Member participating in the competition may enter one International or ISU Judge.

The Entries of Judges must be made via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS) and reach the Organizing Committee, not later than November 25th, 2024. The Panels will be drawn after the closing of entries. The members concerned will be notified of the result of the draw. The Panel of Judges for Novice, Junior and Senior will be composed as determined by the relevant ISU Communications.

The Organizer covers the accommodation expenses with full board only for the confirmed Referees, invited Judges, Technical Controllers and Technical Specialists, Data and Replay Operators, beginning with dinner on December 8th until lunch on December 16, 2024. Travel expenses (based on economy fare) will be covered only for Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialist, Data and Replay Operators and for invited judges. Expenses for transport, accommodation and meals for Competitors, Coaches and other Team officials will not be covered by the organizer.

The ice rink Allianz Tiriac Arena is located across the road from Henri Coanda International Airport. The timetable, results and other information will be announced on the official site of the competition <u>www.edusporttrophy.org</u> and on the information board in the ice rink.

Also, only the daily starting times are fixed. Following the morning start the time schedule of the event is flexible, which means that in case of cancellations certain categories may start some time earlier than in the Preliminary/Final Schedule.

Furthermore, in case the competition cannot take place due to any legal restrictions or public health issues the Organizers bear no responsibility for any damage resulting from the cancellation and thus no claims can be made towards the Organizers.

Cancellation of the competition is also possible due to insufficient number of registered ISU members or competitors.

Notice of cancellation or program changes will be published at least 7 days before the start of the competition. We advise all delegations to take those above into consideration for any travel arrangements.

- There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination and one must be a spin with no change of position. The spin combination with a change of foot and a minimum of eight (8) revolutions or without a change of foot with a minimum of six (6) revolutions. The spin in one position with a change of foot mini minimum of eight (8) revolutions or spin in one position without change of foot minimum of six (6) evolutions. In both spins flying entries are allowed.

- There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface. Levels explanations: For CUBS & CHICKS Free Skating Program, in all elements that are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

- A competitor in the Recreational Basic Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain: RECREATIONAL BASIC 1) A maximum of four (4) jump elements. Only single jumps are permitted, no Axel type jump, no double or triple jumps can be included. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. Any jump cannot be executed more than twice in total.
 - 2) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation) with change of foot (minimum 2 rotation per position, minimum 6 rotation in total) or without change of foot minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Combo spin is allowed. Flying spin is not permitted.

3) There must be a maximum of one (1) Choreo sequence which must be clearly visible. This element has a fixed base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only. The first visible attempt to execute a choreographic sequence will be contributed to the technical score.

Levels explanations: For Recreational basic category, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged: • Composition • Presentation • Skating Skills The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

A competitor in the Recreational Advanced Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

1) Maximum of four (4) jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence consists of 2 (two) jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any listed jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Any single or double jump (including Double Axel) cannot be executed more than twice in total. Triple jumps are not permitted.

2) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum two (2) revolution per position and minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is allowed.

3) There must be a maximum of one (1) Choreo sequence which must be clearly visible. This element has a fixed base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only. The first visible attempt to execute a choreographic sequence will be contributed to the technical score.

Levels explanations: For the Recreational Advanced category, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted.

Any additional features will not be counted for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged: • Composition • Presentation • Skating Skills The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

A competitor in the Bronze Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

a. A maximum of four (4) jump elements, consisting only of single jumps. Axel type jumps, double jumps and triple jumps are not permitted. There may be one (1) jump combination in the free program. The jump combination may consist of two (2) listed jumps. Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times. Waltz jumps will be ignored.

b. A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation, both of which must be a spin in one position with or without a change of foot. Flying spins are not permitted. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) for any spin with no change of foot, and six (6) with a change of foot. A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value. All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V. Only features up to and including Level 1 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

c. A maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence utilizing at least half (1/2) of the ice surface. The pattern is not restricted but the sequence must be clearly visible. A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only.

The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.0.

The warm-up duration is five (5) minutes. Each fall shall receive a deduction of 0.5.

A competitor in the Silver Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

a. A maximum of four (4) jump elements, consisting of any single jumps (including the single Axel). Double jumps and triple jumps are not permitted. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence. One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) listed jumps. The other may have two (2) listed jumps. A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three(3) jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump. Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.

b. A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and six (6) for any spin with a change of foot. A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value. Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions. All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V. Only features up to and including Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

c. A maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface The pattern is not restricted but the sequence must be clearly visible. A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only.

The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.0.

The warm-up duration is five (5) minutes. Each fall shall receive a deduction of 0.5.

A competitor in the Gold Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

a. A maximum of five (5) jump elements, consisting of single jumps (including the single Axel) or double jumps. Double flip, double Lutz, double Axel and triple jumps are not permitted. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence in the free program. One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) listed jumps. The other may have two (2) listed jumps. A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) listed jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third listed jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump. Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.

b. A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation, one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) of which must be a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with a change of foot. A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value. Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions. All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.

c. A maximum of one (1) step sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface.

The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.67.

ADULT GOLD

Only features up to and including Level 3 will be counted for the technical elements. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The warm-up duration is six (6) minutes. Each fall shall receive a deduction of 1.0.

A competitor in the Masters Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

a. A maximum of five (5) jump elements, one of which must be an Axel type jump. Single and double jumps are permitted. No triple or quadruple jumps are allowed. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence in the free program.

One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) listed jumps. The other may have two (2) listed jumps. A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) listed jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump. Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.

b. A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation, one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) of which must be a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance.

The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: five (5) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with a change of foot. A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin. Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions. All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.

c. A maximum of one (1) step sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface.

The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.67.

Features up to and including Level 4 will be counted for the technical elements.

The warm-up duration is six (6) minutes.

Each fall shall receive a deduction of 1.0.

The technical requirements are the same as those for the category "Masters" with the exception that triple jumps are permitted.

The Masters Elite category is intended for skaters who competed previously at the junior or senior level in national or international competition but is not mandatory for such skaters. It is also open to skaters who wish to include double axel and/or triple jumps in the free skating program.

ADULT MASTERS ELITE

Participation in the Free Skating at the International Adult Figure Skating Competitions is open only to competitors who have reached at least the age of twenty-eight (28) before 1st July 2024.

A skater competing after 1st July 2024 in an ISU Championship, International Competition or National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult International Competition or Adult National Championships) or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult National Championship) MAY NOT participate in this competition.

A skater competing prior to 1st July 2024 in an ISU Championship or National Championship of a Member Federation or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National championship of a Member Federation MAY participate in this competition.

A skater meeting the age requirements of this competition, who competes in adult-only events (Single Free Skating) at a National Championships or competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championships of a Member Federation MAY compete in this competition.

All other members of an ISU Member Federation who meet the age requirements may participate.

A competitor who participates in an ISU international adult figure skating competition shall no longer be eligible to participate in an ISU sanctioned senior international competition, as specified in ISU Rule 107, except with the express authorization of the ISU council.
