1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The 21st Edition of Crystal Skate 2024 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2024, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2024, and the relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the competition is open to all Competitors who belong to the ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2526 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2526 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the ISU Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another ISU Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

All participants accept that personal data are collected by the Organizing Committee (OC) and such data are stored and used by the OC, and when necessary, third parties, for the purposes only of, and to the extent necessary only in relation to facilitate their participation in the competition; personal data may include but will not be limited to full legal name as per national identity documents, address, date of birth, nationality, sex.

All competitors must be entered through their Club which must be a member of the ISU Member, based on the age and the level of the Skaters.

Deadline for entries: - All entries (competitors, judges, team leaders, coaches, other participants) are expected not later than <u>October 07th, 2024</u>

- All the entries received starting with October 08th, 2024

it will be considered as late entries

- Late entries are accepted with amendments depending on the number of entries for each category;

Cancellation: - Cancellation of the competitor entry, if any, has to be done till
October 14th 2024

- For any latter cancellation the Federations will be asked to pay the entry fee. In the event of withdrawal, no refunds will be given following the closing date on the 14th October 2024. In the case of a "no-show" at the event, entry fee will not be refunded.

3. ENTRIES

Entries of Competitors: - The entry form must be sent via email to crystalskate.frp@gmail.com not later than October 07th, 2024.

- Program Content Sheet and additional forms can be downloaded from the official website of the competition: www.frponline.ro

- The "Program Content Sheet" for all categories must be returned to the Organizing Committee not later than October 14th, 2024. It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet will be filled precisely by each Skater in English using terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

Entries of Judges and Technical Panel: - Each participating ISU Member has the right to nominate one judge per discipline who has at least the qualification "Judge for International Competitions". However, the OC reserves the right to limit the number of judges in accordance with the number of the Skaters' Entries. Confirmation for Judges will be sent to each Member immediately after the closing of entries. The members concerned will be notified of the result of the draw.

- Each panel of Judges will consist of at least 3 Judges (Referee included) maximum two from the same country.

Entries of Team Members - Official entries of Team Leaders and Coaches will be accepted. Accreditation will be provided to those who are officially accepted by the Organizer.

4. MEALS, LODGING and TRAVEL EXPENSES

Expenses: - The organizer will provide and cover the expenses for travel, rooms, and meals for all Referees, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists, the Data and Replay Operators and invited Judges, during the entire period for which they are on duty.

Should any of the above-mentioned persons arrive at the hotel before or stay longer than the period described above, their room costs and expenses will be the responsibility of the individual and must be paid on arrival.

- The organizer will not cover any expenses for competitors, team leaders, coaches or chaperons.

5. MUSIC

The Members are responsible for submitting their Competitor's music as direct attachment to an email to the Organizing Committee until October 14th, 2024, at crystalskate.frp@gmail.com.

<u>Please note</u>: some music files might exceed the size of a regular email. In this case, an email-based transfer service which allows to send large files could be used to send the file to the OC

- Each submission must be labelled with the name of the ISU Member, name of the category, segment, the name(s) of the competitor and the exact running time of the music (not skating time): *Example:*

 - ROU_Senior_Men_FS_POPESCU-Andrei-Radu-4min05sec
- the music files must be sent as MP3 file formats. Any other format is not acceptable.
- Each Competitor must have a back-up drive (USB Stick) for each program in the format of MP3 file.

<u>Please note:</u> Files in MP3 format may have a significant difference in the music quality when reproduced. The Organizing Committee in this case is not responsible if the music quality would be insufficient.

6. LIABILITY

In accordance with ISU Regulations, Rule 119, all participants act on their own responsibility.

The Organizer accept no liability for bodily or personal injury, or for property loss or damage incurred by any Competitors or any kind of Officials. It is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in the "Crystal Skate", to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means.

The Organizer provides professional First Aid Service on site. The Organizer ensures that personnel of the First Aid Service are experienced doctors. The First Aid Service is on duty throughout the whole event period.

8. ARRIVAL OF PARTICIPANTS / TEAMS

9. ACCREDITATION

The accreditation will start on October, 24th 2024 at the ice rink Allianz Tiriac Arena. In accordance with the ISU Directive please note that at the time of registration we have to copy and file the passport / clearance certificate of the Skaters.

Citizen / Residence requirements and Clearance Procedure:

- In accordance with Rule 109 of ISU Regulations and ISU Communication 2526 or any update of this Communication, all skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate.
- The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the personal identification documents of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.

10. DRAW

The opening draw for the order of skating will be held electronic on October 23rd 2024. Starting order for the free skating of categories Novice Advanced will be in reverse order of the results of the short program.

11. AWARDS

The Organizer provides diplomas for all competitors after each event. The three best Skaters in each category will be awarded with medals.

12. TECHNICAL DETAILS

ADVANCED NOVICE BOYS & GIRLS-

The category will be held in accordance with ISU Communication No. 2624 or any subsequent updates – skater that has reached the age of ten (10) and has not reached the age of sixteen

(16) for girls (Single Skating) and boys (Single Skating), before July 1st preceding the competition.

♦ Short Program

In accordance with ISU Communication No. 2624 or any subsequent updates.

Duration: 2 min., 20 sec. +/- 10 sec.

Free Skating

In accordance with ISU Communication 2624 and the respective ISU Communication. Special attention should be paid to the "well

balanced program" and the element value.

Duration: 3 min. +/- 10 sec.

INTERMEDIATE NOVICE BOYS & GIRLS

The category will be held in accordance with ISU Communication No. 2624 or any subsequent updates – skater that has not reached the age of sixteen (16), before July 1st preceding the competition.

♦ Free Skating

In accordance with ISU Communication 2624 and the respective ISU Communication. Special attention should be paid to the "well balanced program" and the element value.

Duration: 3:00 min, +/- 10 sec.

BASIC NOVICE BOYS & GIRLS

The category will be held in accordance with ISU Communication No. 2624 or any subsequent updates – skater that has not reached the age of fourteen (14), before July 1st preceding the competition.

Free Skating

In accordance with ISU Communication 2624 and the respective ISU Communication. Special attention should be paid to the "well balanced program" and the element value.

Duration: 2:30 min, +/- 10 sec

CUBS BOYS & GIRLS

Age requirements – Cubs is a skater who was born: 01.07.2013 – 30.6.2015

♦ Free Skating

Duration: 2 min, +/- 10 sec

A well-balanced CUBS Free Skating Program must contain:

Maximum of four (4) jump elements one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence. Jump combinations and the jump sequence consist of two (2) jumps. In the jump sequence the second jump must be an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the Axel jump. One full revolution on the ice between the jumps (free foot can touch the ice, but without weight transfer) keeps the element in the frame of the definition of a jump sequence. Jumps executed in a jump sequence receive their full value. No triple and quadruple jumps are allowed. Only one single jump and one double jump (including Double Axel) can be repeated once.

There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination and one must be a spin with no change of position. The spin combination with a change of foot and a minimum of eight (8) revolutions or without a change of foot with a minimum of six (6) revolutions. The spin in one position with a change of foot minimum of eight (8) revolutions or spin in one position without change of foot minimum of six (6) evolutions. In both spins flying entries are allowed.

There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface. Levels explanations:

For Cubs Singles, in all elements that are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged:

- Composition
- Presentation
- **Skating Skills**

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

All other General rules and Technical Requirements are the same as ISU rule for Single Skating Basic Novice - Girls and Boys written in No. 2624 or any subsequent updates. The same ISU Rules regarding judging, refereeing and the work of the Technical Panel apply as in Junior and Senior International Competitions.

CHICKS GIRLS & BOYS

Age requirements - Chicks Skater is a skater who was born: 01.07.2015 and younger

***** Free Skating

Duration: 2 min, +/- 10 sec

A well-balanced CUBS Free Skating Program must contain:

Maximum of four (4) jump elements one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence. Jump combinations and the jump sequence consist of two (2) jumps. In the jump sequence the second jump must be an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the Axel jump. One full revolution on the ice between the jumps (free foot can touch the ice, but without weight transfer) keeps the element in the frame of the definition of a jump sequence. Jumps executed in a jump sequence receive their full value. No triple and quadruple jumps are allowed. Only one single jump and one double jump (including Double Axel) can be repeated once.

There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination and one must be a spin with no change of position. The spin combination with a change of foot and a minimum of eight (8) revolutions or without a change of foot with a minimum of six (6) revolutions. The spin in one position with a change of foot mini minimum of eight (8) revolutions or spin in one position without change of foot minimum of six (6) evolutions. In both spins flying entries are allowed.

There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

Levels explanations:

For Chicks Singles, in all elements that are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged:

- Composition
- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

All other General rules and Technical Requirements are the same as ISU rule for Single Skating Basic Novice - Girls and Boys written in No. 2624 or any subsequent updates. The same ISU Rules regarding judging, refereeing and the work of the Technical Panel apply as in Junior and Senior International Competitions.

RECREATIONAL ADVANCED CATEGORIES

A competitor in the Recreational Advanced Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

- 1) Maximum of four (4) jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence consists of 2 (two) jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any listed jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Any single or double jump (including Double Axel) cannot be executed more than twice in total. Triple jumps are not permitted.
- 2) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum two (2) revolution per position and minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six
- (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is allowed.
- 3) There must be a maximum of one (1) Choreo sequence which must be clearly visible. This element has a fixed base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only. The first visible attempt to execute a choreographic sequence will be contributed to the technical score.

Levels explanations:

For the Recreational Advanced category, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted.

Any additional features will not be counted for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged:

- Composition
- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

RECREATIONAL BASIC CATEGORIES

A competitor in the Recreational Basic Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

- 1) A maximum of four (4) jump elements. Only single jumps are permitted, no Axel type jump, no double or triple jumps can be included. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. Any jump cannot be executed more than twice in total.
- 2) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation) with change of foot (minimum 2 rotation per position, minimum 6 rotation in total) or without change of foot minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Combo spin is allowed. Flying spin is not permitted.
- 3) There must be a maximum of one (1) Choreo sequence which must be clearly

visible. This element has a fixed base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only. The first visible attempt to execute a choreographic sequence will be contributed to the technical score.

Levels explanations:

For Recreational basic category, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged:

- Composition
- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

^{*} In case of a large number of entries the Organizer reserves the right to split the groups according to age. When fewer than 3 skaters register for a singles Free Skating segment, age categories may be combined wherever possible to ensure competition.

ADULTS CATEGORIES - TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

Bronze – Free Skating 1min 40 sec +/- 10 sec

A competitor in the Bronze Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain: **a.** A maximum of four (4) jump elements, consisting only of single jumps. **Axel type jumps, double jumps and triple jumps are not permitted.** There may be up to two (2) jump combinations in the free program. Each jump combination may consist of two (2) listed jumps. Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.

- **b.** A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation, which must be a spin in one position with or without a change of foot. **Flying spins are not permitted.**
- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) for any spin with no change of foot, and six (6) with a change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- Only features up to and including Level 1 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.
- **c.** A maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence utilizing at least half (1/2) of the ice surface.
- A choreographic sequence consists of at least two different movements like spirals, arabesques, spread eagles, Ina Bauer, hydroblading, transitional (unlisted) jumps. Steps and turns may be used to link the two or more different movements together.
- A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only.
- The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.0.
- Each fall shall receive a deduction of 0.5.

The warm-up duration is five (5) minutes.

Silver – Free Skating – 2min +/- 10 sec

A competitor in the Silver Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

- a. A maximum of five (5) jump elements, consisting of any single jumps (including the single Axel). Double jumps and triple jumps are not permitted. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence in the free program.
- One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) jumps. The other may have two (2) jumps.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered a listed jump only when used in combination in between two other listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of connecting footwork.
- b. A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation.
- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and six (6) for any spin with a change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- Only features up to and including Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.
- c. A maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence, utilizing at least half (1/2) of the ice surface.
- A choreographic sequence consists of at least two different movements like spirals, arabesques, spread eagles, Ina Bauer, hydroblading, transitional (unlisted) jumps. Steps and turns may be used to link the two or more different movements together.
- The pattern is not restricted but the sequence must be clearly visible.
- A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only.
- The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.0.
- Each fall shall receive a deduction of 0.5.

The warm-up duration is five (5) minutes.

Gold – Free Skating 2min 50 sec +/- 10 sec

A competitor in the Gold Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

a. A maximum of five (5) jump elements, consisting of single jumps (including the single Axel) or

double jumps. Double flip, double Lutz, double Axel and triple jumps are not permitted. There may be up to three (3) jump combinations or two jump combinations and one (1) jump sequence in the free program.

- One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) jumps. The others may have two (2) jumps each.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered a listed jump only when used in combination in between two other listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of connecting footwork.
- **b.** A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation, one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) of which must be a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance.
- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with a change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- **c.** A maximum of one (1) step sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface.
- The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.67.
- Only features up to and including Level 3 will be counted for the technical elements. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.
- Each fall shall receive a deduction of 1.0.

The warm-up duration is six (6) minutes

Masters - Free Skating 3min +/- 10 sec

A competitor in the Masters Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

- a. A maximum of six (6) jump elements, one of which must be an Axel type jump. Single and double jumps are permitted. There may be up to three (3) jump combinations or two jump combinations and one (1) jump sequence in the free program.
- One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) jumps. The others may have two (2) jumps each.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump.

- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered a listed jump only when used in combination in between two other listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of connecting footwork.
- b. A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation, one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) of which must be a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance
- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: five (5) for any spin with no change

of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with a change of foot.

- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no level and no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- **c.** A maximum of one (1) step sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface.
- The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.67.
- Features up to and including Level 4 will be counted for the technical elements. Each fall shall receive a deduction of 1.0.

The warm-up duration is six (6) minutes.

Masters Elite - Free Skating 3min +/-10 sec

The technical requirements are the same as those for the category "Masters" with the exception that triple jumps are permitted.

Skaters in the Elite category competed internationally for their federation at the Junior or Senior level, made it to their National Championships at the Junior or Senior level, or are currently competing with a

double axel and/or triple jumps.

Participation in the Free Skating at the Adult Figure Skating Categories is open only to competitors who have reached at least the age of twenty-eight (28) before 1st July 2024.

 A skater competing after 1st July 2024 in an ISU Championship, International Competition or National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult International Competition or Adult National Championships) or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult National Championship) MAY NOT participate in this competition.

- A skater competing prior to 1st July 2024 in an ISU Championship or National Championship of a Member Federation or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National championship of a Member Federation MAY participate in this competition.
- A skater meeting the age requirements of this competition, who competes in adult-only events (Single Free Skating) at a National Championships or competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championships of a Member Federation MAY compete in this competition.
- All other members of an ISU Member Federation who meet the age requirements may participate.
