Rules and Regulations

In Short Track Speed Skating a pack of four to eight Skaters race against each other rather than against the clock. Competitors skate a series of Preliminaries, Heats, Quarter-Finals, Semi-Finals and Finals over 500, 1000 and 1500 meters and Relay Events for National teams (composed of four Skaters) over 3000 meters for Women, 5000 meters for Men and 2000 meters for Mixed Team Relay (composed of two Women and two Men). Race winners, second and sometimes third placed Skaters/Teams move up to the next round. Fastest times following qualified skaters may also advance to fill remaining spots in the next round.

Individual Racing Rules

“The race has to be won on its merit” is at the base of all racing rules as the number one priority and all basic rules are created to support this principle and of course the safety of the Skaters. Generally speaking, the Skater/ Team in the lead has priority over the Race. The priority or right of passage of the lead Skater/ Team can be lost or shared based on various situations.

Short Track is a close proximity and contact sport. Some small inconsequential contacts or pushes are tolerated, actions that have a significant impact on the race of other Skaters can lead to Sanctions.

- a) Races are run counter-clockwise, that is to say the inner side of the track is on the left hand side of the Skater/Relay Team;
- b) Overtaking is allowed at all times, but until the Skaters/Relay Teams are besides each other the responsibility for any obstruction or collision shall be upon the Skater/Relay Team overtaking, provided the Skater/Relay Team being overtaken does not act improperly;
- c) Any Skater/Relay Team who is bound to be lapped, either for the first time or other time, must move to the outside and may not interfere with the Skater(s)/Relay Teams overtaking the skater. Violation with interference will result in a Yellow or Red Card.
- d) If a Skater/Relay Team is lapped twice, that Skater/Relay Team shall leave the race unless there are one (1) or more other Skaters/Relay Teams very close to the skater's current race position. Skaters/Relay Teams who have left the race on basis of this rule shall be recorded as not finished. If the Referee, at the skater's discretion, feels that the Skater/Relay Team was prevented from finishing due to reasons beyond the Skaters/Relay Teams control, then the Referee may declare the Skater/Relay Team having reached the finish but no time shall be recorded;
- e) A Skater/Relay Team has completed the distance when the Skater has reached the finish line with the leading tip of the skate blade.

Infringements:

- a) The general racing rule is that the Skaters/Relay Teams by their way of skating shall contribute to the honest sporting and safe progress of the race in order to determine the result of the race on its merits;
- b) Breaches of the racing rules are considered as follows:
 - OFF-TRACK: skating with one or both skates on the left side of the curve, marked by track marking blocks;

- IMPEDING: Impeding, blocking, charging, or pushing another Skater with any part of the body. Interfere with another Skater by crossing his/her course thereby causing contact;
- ASSISTANCE: Each Skater shall compete as an individual. Any assistance from other Skaters will be cause for sanctions of all Skaters/Relay Teams involved. This will not apply to the push the Skater receives from their Team-mate in a Relay race.
- KICKING OUT: Kicking out of any skate during any part of a race thereby causing danger including at the finish line or throwing the body across the finish line is forbidden.
- RELAYING NON TOUCH: The relay has taken place without a touch or that the touch has not been obvious, clearly shown, and seen by the Referee or Assistant Referees;
- RELAYING DURING THE LAST TWO LAPS: The last relay has not been clearly started before the commencement of the final two laps.

Relay Racing Rules

a) Teams consist of maximum of the following number of Competitors:

- b) All members of a Team shall wear the same racing suit. Teams which do not comply with this shall be excluded from participation in the respective race. For Competitions where Skaters from different nations form a team, a simple and easy identification system will be sufficient;
- c) A Skater will be in the race and be responsible for the Team until that Skater is relayed by a Team member. Relaying will be by touch, that is to say a Skater will not be in the race until that Skater has been touched by, or has touched the Skater he is relieving;
- d) A Skater may be relayed at any time except during the last two (2) laps. These laps must be skated by one Skater. A warning shot will be fired to indicate the start of the last three (3) laps;
- e) In the case of a fall during the last two (2) laps, the Skater may be relayed.
- f) A Skater from a team can only come on the track to make an exchange. Skaters entering before an exchange and skaters exiting after an exchange are also subjected to the applicable racing rules. For eventual additional rules for Mixed Gender team competitions see the respective ISU Communication.
- g) The non-racing members of each team must stay out of the path of the racing Skaters and in an area that is clearly inside curves, marked by track marking blocks and a virtual line between the last block and the first block

of the curves. Only to make an exchange, a Skater may leave this area. The line between the last and first block may be marked by dots.

- h) Exchanges are to be made without interference to other teams. During exchanges, changing the lane is not allowed and exchanges are to be made straight forward, directly in front of the Skater who is pushing, and the skates have to be kept out of blocking.
- i) Interference inside the track with Skaters coming in to take an exchange may also be considered an infringement.

Mixed Team Relay Racing Rules

- j) The Individual Racing Rules, paragraphs 1 and 2, and the Relay Racing Rules, paragraphs 3 and 4, shall apply to Mixed Team Relay Races, that means for all members of the Team, both participating and relayed Team members.
- k) Unless otherwise specified, Mixed Relay Teams consist of a minimum of two and a maximum of four Women and a minimum of two and a maximum of four Men.
- l) For each race any two of the four named Women and any two of the four named Men must take part in the race.
- m) Races will be over 2000 m (18 laps).
- n) The members of the Team have to relay following a fixed schedule: first, 4 x 2,5 laps, then 4 x 2 laps, and always in the following order of exchanges: Woman-Woman-Man-Man. The racing order per Gender is left to the Team.
- o) In case of a fall, only a Skater from the same gender can cover the relay for the Team, except in the very last corner before a scheduled exchange 52 to the other gender, a Skater from opposite gender can take the relay and keep on going.
- p) In exceptional cases when a Team cannot make an exchange because of actions from other Teams, the exchanges can be made half a lap later.
- q) In the last two laps of the race, if there is a fall any Team member can take the relay.

Relay Infringements:

- a) The individual racing rules, paragraphs 1 and 2, shall apply to Relay races, that is to say for all members of the Team, both participating and relayed Team members;
- b) Breaches of the relay racing rules are considered as follows:
 - RELAYING NON TOUCH: The relay has taken place without a touch or that the touch has not been obvious, clearly shown, and seen by the Referee or Assistant Referees;
 - RELAYING DURING THE LAST TWO (2) LAPS: The last relay has not been clearly started before the commencement of the final two (2) laps.
 - In Mixed Team Relay: The relaying order and planned schedule as described in paragraph 3 has not been followed.

Team Racing Rules

- a) A Team consists of a minimum of two (2) Skaters.
- b) The finish position and time recorded by the last Skater of the Team finishing determines the result of the Team.
- c) The Skaters shall compete as a Team and may assist each other.
- d) A Skater may push a member of the same Team as long as this does not impede any Skater from another Team.

Team Racing Infringements

The Individual Racing Rules (paragraphs 1 and 2) shall apply to Team Racing Rules, unless otherwise specified.

Sanction for Infringements of the Racing Rules or the ISU Code of Ethics

The term “disqualification” as used in Rule 123 paragraph 4.B shall be understood to describe the various sanctions mentioned in this Rule including without limitation the following type of sanctions:

Penalty:

- for an infringement of the Racing Rules.

Yellow Card:

- for an unsafe, harmful or hazardous offence;
- for more than one infringements of the Racing Rule “Impeding” and/or “Kicking Out” independent of each other resulting in a penalty, made in one (1) race;
- for other actions explicitly so specified in these rules.

Red Card:

- The Red Card is only used for extreme behavior. A Skater receiving two (2) Yellow Cards in the same Event receives automatically a Red Card.

The Skater/Relay Team who received a Penalty will be disqualified in the relevant race in which the infringement occurred, and will be excluded from participating in the next round of the distance/competition concerned. With the exception of Final A, where Rule 295, paragraph 6.b) applies, the Skater/Relay Team will forfeit the points/result accrued in that race alone. Points/results accrued prior to that race will not be affected.

The Skater/Relay Team who was been given a Yellow Card will be disqualified in the relevant race in which the infringement occurred and excluded from participating in the next round of the distance/competition concerned. The Skater/Relay Team will forfeit prior points/results accrued in all races over the distance/competition concerned. The right of the Skater to participate in other distances/competitions, or the results achieved in previous or next other distances/competitions are not affected.

If a Yellow Card is issued to a relay team due to the action of a single skater or as a result of two cumulative penalties by the same skater, that Yellow Card will count as cumulative for that specific skater only. However, if a Yellow Card is given due to cumulative penalties involving two different skaters from the same team, the Yellow Card will not be considered cumulative.

Skaters who receive a Red Card will be barred from further participation in any race, whether individual or relay, and will not be included in the final individual classification. The results of any completed individual distances by the skater before receiving the Red Card will remain unaffected.

A relay team that receives a Red Card will be disqualified from the relevant race and will not be ranked in the final relay classification. Additionally, the skater who receives the Red Card will be prohibited from participating in any further races, individual or relay, and will not be ranked in the final classification for any individual distances not yet completed. The results of individual distances completed prior to the relay disqualification will remain valid.

If a Skater has accumulated two (2) Red Cards within 12 months, that Skater shall automatically be suspended from participation in all ISU Events, the Olympic Winter Games, the Youth Olympic Winter Games, and International Competitions for a minimum of two (2) months or three (3) applicable competitions whichever is the longer period.

If any of the Skaters/Relay Teams have been sanctioned under this Rule for conduct occurring before the race is stopped, such Skater(s), and the Skater's Relay Team (if the race is a Relay race), will not take part in the re-run;

In the case of a re-start of a Relay race substitution within each team is allowed.

Any Skater, for whom the race has been stopped (to preserve the Skater's well-being), will not be allowed to take part in the re-start, unless the Skater was unable to continue due to reasons beyond their control. This does not apply to the starting procedure. The results of Skater(s) excluded for this reason from a re-start will show 'Did not finish' (Record as DNF). This also applies to Relay Teams. If the Skater is injured resulting from an action by another Skater for which a penalty is given, the Referee may advance the injured Skater or let the Skater participate in the re-start or re-run.

ISU Short Track World Tour

For the 2024/25 season, the ISU introduced the ISU Short Track World Tour (instead of the World Cup Short Track). The ISU Short Track World Tour Series season consists of six international events. All Skaters entered for a World Tour Competition must have achieved an ISU qualifying time over the distance of 500 meters. The ISU Short Track Speed Skating Technical Committee has determined qualifying times required for participation in the ISU Short Track World Tour 2024/25 as follows:

- ❖ Women 500 meters: 48,04 (16% slower than world record as of July 1, 2024)
- ❖ Men 500 meters: 45,83 (16% slower than world record as of July 1, 2024)

If an ISU Member enters more than 1 Skater, the qualifying times required for all Skaters (including all Relay Skaters) entered by the ISU Member, are:

- ❖ Women 500 meters: 46,39 (12% slower than world record as of July 1, 2024)
- ❖ Men 500 meters: 44,25 (12% slower than world record as of July 1, 2024)

The competitions have a single distance character and are held in separate sessions. The first day is a Qualifying Session. On the second and third days the last Qualifying Rounds including repechage races, (if necessary) take place usually in the morning preceding the World Tour session that day.

On the distances 500, 1000 and 1500 meters there are A and B Finals. Skaters qualify for A and B Finals only through the Semi-Finals.

Relay Teams consist of four or six Skaters, which are all considered as participants. During any Relay race in a competition, a maximum of four Skaters shall compete. Entries of Teams with less than four or more than six Skaters are not accepted. All Skaters of a team must belong to the same ISU Member.

Cristal Globe

The ISU Short Track World Tour events aim to crown the champions who accumulate the most points over the season, awarding them the prestigious Crystal Globe Trophy.

First introduced in the 2022/23 season, the Crystal Globe recognizes the top individual male and female skaters with the highest total World Tour points. In the 2024/25 season, a new Team Crystal Globe will be introduced to honor the team with the most accumulated points throughout the season.

A new standardized program for each day of the World Tour Sessions will be followed:

World Tour Points & World Tour Classifications

For each of the Individual Distances, the following point system will be used for the World Tour Classification.

Only Skaters with a result on the distance classification in the Main Sessions will receive World Tour Points. Skaters without World Tour points will nevertheless also have a ranking based on the distance classification.

For the Relay Races, the same point system will be used and all Relay Teams participating will get World Tour points.

For each individual distance, the Skater's best five (5) out of potentially six (6) World Tour points scores from ISU World Tour Competitions will be considered for the World Tour distance classification.

For each of the Relay distances, the best five (5) results from the Distance Classifications at ISU World Tour Competitions will be considered for the World Tour classification.

Classification for the Season's Overall Team Champions and winner of the ISU Short Track World Tour Team Crystal Globe Trophy 2024/25

For the season 2024/25, new Overall World Team Classification will be introduced. Points are accumulated by adding World Tour Points gained from all of the individual results of all team members across all categories (Women and Men) for each team and adding points from all Relay Races in all World Tour Events. The World Tour Points gained for the Relay Races will be tripled (see table below). All the points from all events will count (i.e. every World Tour point given to Skaters/Team throughout the season will be taken into consideration).

ISU Short Track Speed Skating Championships

There are four ISU Championships held every season as of 2020 with the ISU Four Continents Short Track Speed Skating Championships, the European Championships, World Junior Championships and World Championships. All Championships have a single distances format.

The winning individual Skater/Team of the Championships is the one which has been declared winner of the Final A race and is awarded the Gold medal. The Skaters/Teams placed second and third in Final A are awarded the Silver and Bronze medal respectively.

ISU Junior World Tour

For Juniors, there are three ISU Junior World Cup Short Track events held in the 2024/25 season in Bormio (ITA) Nov 8-10 and Nov 14-16 and in Quebec (CAN) Feb 21-23.
